

Cabo San Lucas, Mexico

Millennia ago, Cabo San Lucas was part of the Mexican mainland. Then a massive rupture of the San Andreas Fault sent the waters of the Pacific crashing into the newly formed depression, creating the Sea of Cortez and the Baja Peninsula. Lying at the very tip of Baja, where the Pacific meets the Sea of Cortez, Cabo San Lucas - or "Cabo" - is one of the premier resort destinations in the Western Hemisphere. Swim in the transparent waters, marvel at the wealth of marine life, relax on one of the white-sand beaches or try your hand at some of the finest sportfishing in the world.

Note: Your ship will anchor in Cabo San Lucas and use launches to transport all passengers ashore.

Enjoy a memorable day at a breathtaking Cabo San Lucas beachfront property. In addition, the resort's soft white sandy beach Cabo San Lucas Bay is great for enjoying leisurely walks while the breezes of the Sea of Cortez gently caress you at every turn. You'll want to bring your camera to capture the spectacular ocean views.

An exclusive reserved area right on the beach and a gorgeous sparkling pool beckon you, and a comfortable lounge chair is the perfect opportunity to work on your tan. A Mexican taco bar and two beverages will be served for lunch and you will have the option of purchasing additional drinks.

4x4 Desert & Camel Adventure

A short informational briefing begins your day, travel to the paradisaical coast ranch then climb aboard your 4x4 off-road vehicle at San Cristobal on the Pacific coastal area of Los Cabos. Along the way, your guide will explain the local customs of this traditional town.

The Cabo San Lucas coastline was untouched until 1542, when a European explorer from Spain, Juan Rodriguez Cabrillo, first made contact with the native Pericu people living there. With the increasing popularity of exploration and trade in the area came bands of pirates who lay in wait in the coves and inlets along the coast. In the early 20th century, an abundance of tuna was discovered in the waters and a new industry was born. In the 1950s Cabo San Lucas became a hideaway for Hollywood stars who would frequent the area and participate in sport fishing tournaments, such as John Wayne, Bing Crosby, Sammy Hagar, and John Travolta.

Now, this once-sleepy fishing village has become a bustling vacation paradise. Considered the jewel of the Baja Peninsula, it combines the best of traditional Mexico with lively attractions and sights.

A local host awaits you at the typical Baja-style ranch. Here, you'll enjoy a traditional Baja meal and participate in a tortilla-making presentation and a tequila tasting. What a wonderful way to experience and savor the Mexican culture and spirit.

Enjoy an optional 20 minute two-person camel ride on the secluded beach.

Finish your day with by enjoying marvelous views and great photo opportunities of the bay. Return to the pier area and walk to your

ship.

The 2-person all-terrain Honda Big Red or Mini Jeep ATV have side-by-side seating, allowing you to share and enjoy the experience with a companion. The controls are quite similar to a car and it is quite easy to drive these vehicles.

Once everyone is comfortable, your guide will lead the way and you will all caravan together on an off-road adventure through the beautiful, desolate desert landscape.

Travel down dry riverbeds and climb rugged hilltops for sweeping views of the powerful mountains, harsh desert, and vast Pacific Ocean. During your frequent photo stops your guide will provide information about all that you see. Learn about the varied flora and fauna and the indigenous Cardon cacti, the world's largest of the species. As you ride along the dramatic coastline, look for the migrating gray whales that are a common sight during specific months. This opportunity to discover the true Baja peninsula, away from the tourists, is one you will treasure. You'll capture wonderful photos and make lasting memories on this "road less traveled" experience.

At the completion of your safari, return to bustling Cabo San Lucas. You have the option to enjoy independent sightseeing in town if you wish and you are then responsible for your return to ship.

Sea of Cortez Yacht Cruise

A warm and welcoming staff will greet you at the pier and escort you aboard a 72-foot custom-built yacht. Your vessel boasts two staterooms and comes complete with two full bathrooms, a fully outfitted kitchen, living room, and dining room. Tour capacity is limited to keep your experience private and intimate.

Cruise past Cabo's famous landmarks including Land's End, secluded Lover's Beach, the charming sea lion colony, and El Arco, the iconic natural landmark and magnificent rock formation.

Recline in the sun or take in the views from the shaded deck as you cruise. If you prefer, you can retreat to the air-conditioned interior. You'll pass the vacation mansions of Hollywood's stars and the financial world's elite all nestled on the cliffs facing the Pacific. Pristine, emerald green golf courses dot the landscape and spectacular developments exude luxury.

Your yacht will then skirt the coast to one of Cabo's best Sea of Cortez snorkel sites. All gear is ready for you to view the underwater beauty on a guided snorkel tour of Chileno or Santa Maria cove. They are protected marine sanctuaries known for their remarkably crystal-clear waters. Colorful corals, sponges, and bright urchins can be found along with an endless array of tropical fish. You may even have time to take one of the kayaks for a spin in the tranquil waters.

Beverages, grilled kabobs, seasonal fruits, and other treats are set out for you to snack on.

On your return trip back to the marina, you might have a chance to sit down in one of the two sport fishing fighting chairs and try

your hand at landing a marlin or dorado! Enjoy the breathtaking view coming back into Cabo with your ship, El Arco, and the city spread out before you. During season, whales might be spotted en route.

Your tour includes snorkel gear (vests, fins, snorkel and mask), kayaks and fishing equipment, open bar (alcohol only after water activities) and snacks. Comfortable clothing, swimsuits, towels, sun protection, change of clothes suggested. Sensible shoes required - no high heels. Whale sighting possible during season.

Minimum age to participate is 18 years. Once participants join their tour, they will be required to complete a liability waiver.

Chileno Bay Sail & Snorkel

SJD-780 Approximately 3.5 hours / From \$79



After a brief safety orientation, board your deluxe motorized catamaran and sail from the pier past Lover's Beach, a breathtaking secluded beach only accessible by boat. On one side lies tranquil Cabo San Lucas Bay and on the other, the pounding waves of the Pacific are a dramatic sight to behold. Nearby, a loveable colony of sea lions make their home and the impressive rock formations at Land's End make for spectacular photographs.

Your boat heads across the bay eastward down the coast towards Chileno Bay, located about 11 miles from Cabo San Lucas. Knowledgeable guides will offer instruction and provide you with all your snorkeling equipment and safety vest. Enter the crystal waters with your guide and begin an underwater adventure.

The marine life is spectacular and you will see a rainbow of tropical fish, including Moorish idols and king and Cortez angelfish. These waters are particularly fertile and are home to hundreds of species of fish, each more colorful than the next. In addition, there is an extremely diverse spectrum of corals, sponges, and urchins, as well as sea turtles and octopi. If you are lucky, you may even see a pod of playful dolphins swimming by.

For those who prefer to work on their tan, take a short swim to the sand beach or lounge across the bow nets of the catamaran.

Throughout your excursion, the well-stocked onboard bar serves nonalcoholic beverages, and at the completion of the snorkeling, complimentary adult beverages are served. Delicious snacks are provided, as are fresh water showers. The sails are hoisted as you pass the luxury coastline resorts on your cruise back to the pier.

Sea of Cortez Zodiac Raft & Snorkel

Board your Zodiac, skippered by an experienced eco-guide, directly at the pier. Participate in a safety briefing and orientation. Then, you're off! This high-speed thrill ride takes you to Land's End for photo opportunities of the famed Lover's Beach, the sea lion colony, and the towering rock formation known as El Arco. After seeing some of the area's most noted sights, head eastward across the bay, then along the coast.

Chileno Bay is the first snorkeling site you will visit. Explore the crystal waters and the variety of marine life. Reboard your Zodiac via small ladder at the back of the boat, enjoy a refreshing drink, and then cruise to the lovely palm-lined Santa Maria Cove for your second snorkeling experience.

Both of these bays are protected marine sanctuaries known for their remarkably clear waters since they are sheltered from the more turbulent water and wind coming off the Sea of Cortez. During your snorkeling excursion you will see a spectacular display of Mother Nature at her best. Colorful corals, sponges, and bright urchins can be found along with an endless array of tropical fish. Pods of dolphins and schools of manta rays have also been spotted.

The tranquil waters make snorkeling a pleasure and the calm bay welcomes all levels. Snorkeling equipment is included as well as bottled water and soft drinks. Your return ride to the pier is a Zodiac-lovers delight.

Snorkeling is from the boat, and snorkel sites may vary with sea and wind conditions. Snorkeling equipment including snorkel vest are provided and must be worn. Passengers should have basic swimming skills. Wear your swim suit and bring a towel. Sunglasses and a hat are suggested. No restroom or changing facility on the boat.

Minimum age is 8 to participate. Once participants join their tour, they will be required to complete a liability waiver.

Pirate Ship Sail & Snorkel

Step back in time the moment you set sail on your pirate ship one of the only working wooden sailing ships on the Mexican Pacific Coast. Feel the wood planks beneath your feet, marvel at the cannons poking out of the gun ports, and feel the power when you take the wheel and help hoist the sails.

You'll cruise past such famous nautical landmarks as El Arco, the magnificent natural formation carved from the ocean's currents, secluded Lover's Beach, and Land's End.

During your cruise, the captain and crew will entertain you with tales from the days when pirates roamed the Mexican waters. They'll also narrate the true story of Thomas Cavendish, who in 1587 captured the famed Spanish galleon, the "Santa Ana," loaded with 450 tons of treasure in these very waters.

The captain and crew will lower the anchor of this lovely sailboat; then you'll have a chance to swim in the clear water. An abundance of marine life here makes this an excellent place to snorkel. A large swim ladder provides easy access into the water and snorkel gear is included. An open bar with bottled water, refreshments, a basket of fresh fruit and healthy snacks are included. In an area rich in pirate lore and stories of buried treasure, those who think Baja is only about Missions and cave paintings cannot afford to miss this aspect of local history.

Begin your day with a short walk from the pier to the beautiful Cabo Dolphin Center. Designed by the award-winning Mexican architect Enrique Norten, the Cabo Dolphin Center is an impressive architectural sight that has been designed with a minimalist theme to properly showcase the star attraction, a wonderful family of Pacific bottlenose dolphins. In addition to the dolphin habitat, you will also find a snack bar and gift shop. A team of experienced photographers and videographers are available to capture your day, since the use of personal cameras is restricted for the safety and welfare of the animals.

Your dolphin swim begins with a brief presentation on dolphin characteristics and behaviors. A knowledgeable marine trainer will teach you how to use hand signals and positive reinforcement to communicate with the dolphins. In water session is 40 minutes

Dolphins are one of nature's smartest, most intuitive animals. Pacific bottlenose dolphins are sleek, active animals who love to swim, dive and perform playful tricks. You can even hear them laughing when they are having fun in the ocean. Dolphins are quite genial and there are even stories of them helping sailors who have been swept overboard or surfers who are injured in the water. There is nothing to fear; the experience of being in the water with these creatures is truly magical.

You'll soon discover the joy of hugging, kissing, and interacting with your fine "flippered" friends. You'll be amazed at their intelligence and skill.

The highpoint of your day is the thrilling one-on-one swim. Hold on tight! It's an exhilarating and memorable experience that you'll never forget! The choice of a dorsal fin ride, belly ride or the amazing underwater dolphin ride awaits!

At the completion of your swim, give a final farewell to your loveable new friends and leave the Cabo Dolphin Center with wonderful memories of your amazing experience.

This tour has a 40 minutes in water with a dolphin, including the ride. Personal cameras are not allowed in the dolphin pool area or observation areas. Lifejackets are provided and required. Guests must know how to swim. Minimum age is 5 years old to participate. Every child under 10 must be accompanied by a paying adult (over 18-years-old) in the water. (Ratio one adult to one child) Please do not wear sunscreen or jewelry. Passengers may wish to wear a T-shirt as sunscreen will contaminate the water and is not permitted. To protect the dolphin's skin, no jewelry of any kind can be worn. This excursion is not available to pregnant women. Wear a swimsuit, bring a towel and extra cash. Once participants join their tour, they will be required to complete a liability waiver

El Arco Cruise & Scenic Views

Board your catamaran cruise at the dock and set out on an excursion to El Arco, the majestic rock formation delineating where the waters of the Sea of Cortez meet the Pacific at Land's End.

Thundering waves and strong ocean currents created The Arch, this magnificent natural landmark and iconic symbol of the area. Years ago, it was used by pirates as a hiding place where they could lie in wait to ambush the merchant ships heading for the west coast.

As you sail the azure blue waters, a taped narration by Jean-Michel Cousteau provides commentary on the area's ecology and points of interest. Keep your cameras ready since the waters teem with wildlife and you may see pelicans, sea lions, and playful seals.

At the completion of your boat ride, board taxi vans for a short drive through town en route to a local restaurant, famous for its panoramic views of the Bay of Cabo San Lucas. From this cantilevered venue, enjoy views of your cruise ship and the dramatic Arch in the background. Relax in the beautiful natural surroundings while admiring the spectacular vistas.

Another short drive takes you back through town to your ship at the pier.

As you sail the waters, a taped narration by Jean-Michel Cousteau provides commentary on the area's ecology and points of interest. Watch for the wildlife including pelicans, sea lions, and playful seals.

At the completion of your boat ride, board a minivan for a brief drive through town en route to a local restaurant, famous for its beachside location and wonderful food, hospitality and spirit. Enjoy a light Mexican lunch and two cool beverages before heading down to the beach. You'll enjoy free time to swim and sunbathe or participate in water activities, which are available for an additional fee. Make sure to have your towel, swimsuit, and sunscreen so that you can make the most of the day.

Cultural Highlights & Scenic Drive

Board your air-conditioned transportation for a scenic drive through the Baja California desert terrain. The varied landscape and indigenous vegetation make for picturesque landscapes, and you'll want to keep an eye out for the odd looking boojum tree, with its right-angle branches, which exists only in Baja California along with the cardon, the world's largest cactus.

Your first stop is a local glass-blowing factory. Step inside this colorful wonderland and watch artisans at work. Glass blowing is a true art form, and you will see the centuries old technique firsthand. It is quite mesmerizing to witness, and if you are lucky, a glass hummingbird or flower will be produced right before your eyes. Today, Mexico is well known for affordable, rustic hand-blown drinking glasses, many of them characterized by a cobalt blue band at the rim. The factory employs over 30 artisans and produces as many as 500 one-of-a-kind pieces each day, many made with recycled glass. After touring the factory, take a moment to stop in the well stocked gift shop so you can bring these lovely, decorative pieces home with you.

Continue your tour at the quaint, authentic Mexican town of San Jose del Cabo. Stroll along the charming streets independently and view the fascinating historical sights. As early as the 1500s, sailors referred to San Jose as a "safe watering place," an important stop for boats that were low on provisions. It was also an area where pirates lay in wait, ready to ambush the Spanish ships that came through the waters loaded with silver and gold. Now, tree lined boulevards mark the shopping district and the town plaza. Mexican handicrafts can be found as well as souvenirs. You will see colorful sidewalk murals painted by schoolchildren and the charming "Zocalo," or town square. The spires of the Church of St. Joseph tower above the town, and its roots can be traced to the San Jose mission, built by Spanish missionaries in 1730.

After seeing so many wonderful sights, the most beautiful vistas are still to come. One of the area's most renowned restaurants offers you a refreshing complimentary beverage while you take in sweeping panoramic views of the Bay of Cabo San Lucas. The restaurant is cantilevered over the water, so you can sit in a nice shaded spot and look out over the bay. You will see the famous El Arco in the distance as well as your ship at anchor.

Prior to returning to port, you will have the option to be dropped off in the charming cobblestoned town of Cabo San Lucas for independent sightseeing. Stroll the broad pedestrian promenade, admire the pretty boats in the marina, delight to the music of mariachis and follow your nose to the delicious open-air grills that serve fresh seafood tacos, a signature of Cabo. You are responsible for your returning to the ship, but you'll find the 10-minute walk easy and pleasant.

This six-hour excursion offers a little bit of everything you look for on vacation: amazing scenery, fascinating history, enchanting culture, and tropical charm. And did we mention shopping?

After meeting your guide at the pier you'll board your air-conditioned transportation bound for the colonial city of Granada. Sit back and enjoy the expert commentary as you pass the sights during your scenic 90-minute ride. But before you arrive in Granada you'll stop in the village of La Virgen, one of the few places where you can get an up close look at Lake Nicaragua, Central America's largest lake. The island you see rising from the center of the lake is Ometepe, a UNESCO Biosphere Preserve and home to two majestic volcanoes.

Back on your transportation, you'll continue through the lush countryside before making a second stop at Catarina Viewpoint. As you get out and stretch your legs you'll marvel at the panoramic views of Apoyo Lagoon Natural Reserve, which was formed by a strong volcanic explosion approximately 23,000 years ago. After you've snapped your photos, you'll have time to browse the nearby craft stalls for souvenirs.



Enjoy a brief visit to the picturesque, colonial city of Granada (founded in 1524 by Spanish conquerors) where you can indulge in a delicious, complimentary lunch at a one of the city's local restaurants. As you head back to San Juan del Sur following your satisfying volcano eco-adventure, you will be treated to a stop at the breathtaking La Virgen Crossing that offers stunning vistas of some of Nicaragua's most beautiful landmarks. Have your cameras at the ready as you marvel at the awe-inspiring beauty of the twin volcanoes, Maderas and Concepcion, which form the island of Ometepe in the massive Lake Nicaragua, one of the largest freshwater lakes in the world and home to a volcano chain, hundreds of beautiful islets and the only freshwater shark on the planet.

Poas Volcano, Sarchi, Country Drive & Lunch





Discover Costa Rica on this adventurous day-long tour, which starts with a scenic drive through countryside en route to the Poas volcano. The road to Poas is a colorful one, and you will view sweeping coffee plantations and incredible valleys, plus sugar cane and strawberry fields, all narrated by your friendly guide, while you relax on your air-conditioned transportation. Poás Volcano National Park is one of the most popular excursions in the northern Central Valley and on arrival you will see why - the volcano is a magnificent natural wonder, with a truly unique character.

Sitting at 8,500 feet above sea level, it is boasts one of the few active craters in the Americas and is famed for its geyser-like eruptions of gas and ash. The main crater, which is usually active with smoke discharges, features an enormous pit measuring 1.5 km in diameter and 300 meters deep. At the bottom of the crater, there's a hot, circular lagoon that measures 350 meters across, where water temperatures range between 40°C and 70°C (110-150 F). You will then tour the visitor's center with your guide, who will explain all the geological exhibits, before enjoying lunch at a local restaurant. After lunch, on your journey to port, you will stop at Sarchi, a village that is famous for its production of brightly colored, hand painted oxcarts. Your guide will point out any wildlife, which could include several species of birds, monkeys, butterflies and other mammals that inhabit the area. After the walk concludes, continue on to the Pura Vida Gardens, one of the most spectacular private gardens in Costa Rica. Boasting beautifully manicured gardens, you will notice that they are also bordered by one of the tallest waterfalls in the country.

Pura Vida is home to over 60,000 flowering plants, including 60 varieties of heliconia, ten varieties of ginger, and orchids. Monteverde, which means "Green Mountain" in Spanish, is a small and beautiful village founded by Quakers in the 1950s. As you walk along you'll learn about the butterfly's life cycle and its importance in nature. San Jose, National Theater, Sarchi & Lunch

Costa Rica will come to life for you on this day-long excursion through lush valleys, green pasturelands and the country's fascinating capital city. After boarding your air-conditioned transportation, you will travel the scenic Pan American Highway, journeying through the small towns of San Ramon and Naranjo, towards lively San Jose. At Naranjo, there will be a fun detour to Sarchi, home of Costa Rica's famous oxcart painting tradition. It was here in Sarchi that, more than a century ago, primitive local artists began painting and decorating their traditional oxcarts in intricate, colorful designs.

The Eloy Alfaro Oxcart Factory is the country's only oxcart factory whose machines are powered by a water wheel. The idea for this unique factory began with Eloy Alfaro, known fondly as Lolo, who began creating oxcarts in 1923 at that time, the only means of transporting the precious coffee to the port for exportation. He later expanded his workshop to include the production of furniture

and handcrafts. Once the oxcarts are constructed, the wheels and axle are created using the "hoop tire" method, a process developed in the early 19th century in which the iron wheel fittings are shrunk to produce an extremely tight fit that binds the various wheel parts and axle together. The carts are then painted in the traditional designs and bright colors which have made of Sarchi, the birthplace of Costa Rica's artisans. In July of 2006 the World's Largest Oxcart was built in Eloy Alfaro's workshop. It is 42 feet long, 12 feet high and weights more than 1 ½ tons. The oxcart is now on display in Sarchi's central park.

Leaving Sarchi, you will then call in at Grecia's metal church, so-called because it's made entirely of pre-fabricated red steel plates, for a memorable photo stop. Then, after arriving in San Jose, you will have an hour to enjoy a regional lunch buffet accompanied by traditional Costa Rican music, at Valle del Sol, a private colonial estate that boasts beautiful gardens and a relaxing waterfall. Afterwards, your scenic drive around this cosmopolitan capital continues, taking in the Metropolitan Cathedral and the incredible National Theater, considered the most beautiful building in the country. Enjoy its ornate 19th-century, neoclassical architecture, elaborate murals, and gilded baroque fixtures, before visiting the National Museum. This historical building is housed in a former army barracks, and was the scene of fighting during the 1948 civil war. Your guide will point out the bullet riddled stone walls, as well as the vast collection of archaeological and historic artifacts, including a display of replicas and original pieces from the city's Gold Museum.

Your return journey to Puntarenas includes a drive though San Jose's exclusive tree lined Rohrmoser district, La Sabana Park and the famed Opera House, including a brief photo-stop at the National Museum for an up-close look at Costa Rica's past.

RIVERS OF JOY HOT SPRINGS & SPA

Your visit to the Rivers of Joy, Hot Springs and Spa, will not only give you the opportunity to enjoy the generous hot springs of "Rio Perdido" but the convergence with the "Rio Blanco" where you can enjoy the different pools temperatures, the spectacular views of the "Rincon de La Vieja Volcano", and for a nominal fee, the spa for those of us who want to pamper their soul.

"Río Perdido", or quite appropriately, Lost River, is perfectly hidden by its host canyon and a canopy of dense flora. This is a place where highly mineralized, geothermal heated waters flow from underneath massive boulders. Not far from the generous springs, the hot water is quenched, as the river pours into the larger and cooler "Río Blanco". This specific place is considered to be magical by the locals. Here, a third body of water -a small stream- falls 80 feet from its cliff top finale, into the Río Blanco, making it an impressive point of convergence; a beautiful act of nature were waters meet.

Explore the banks of this treasured thermal river, and bathe in its waters. Take a walk or cross hanging bridges from where the views will make even the wary stop right at the middle and just gaze, or search for unique fauna in a protected habitat.

The property utilizes 100% clean energy from internal and local sources. Efficient technology for lighting and cooking is used, and there's not really a need for heating water here, as the volcano's subterranean magma channels kindly take care of this.



This super-enjoyable and educational guided half day excursion starts with a delightful ride through rustic countryside, passing a variety of landscapes including rich farmland, lush forests and mountain views as you approach the highlands of Naranjo, an area famous for its coffee production. Arriving at the Espiritu Santo coffee plantation you will be struck by its sheer size and natural beauty. 

It is interesting to note that despite the large amounts of fine emeralds exported by the conquistadors to Spain, there are no grand examples of emerald jewelry among the Spanish crown jewels. It seems the Spanish were content to sell or trade these emeralds for gold to other empires and royalty in places such as Egypt, India and Persia. In fact the Crown Jewels of Persia (Iran) probably contain the single most exquisite collection of fine emerald jewelry in the world.

You'll learn fascinating facts like these and enjoy an ever-changing panorama of sights and sounds during your return drive to the pier. 

Colonial Cartagena Sightseeing Tour On Your Own

CTG-395 Approximately 3.5 hours / From \$39



Your three-and-a-half-hour tour begins as you board your air-conditioned transportation for a scenic, narrated drive to downtown Cartagena. Once you arrive, you'll be guided along a walk lined with monuments of the former leaders of Colombia. Once inside the walled city, you'll receive a brief overview and a map, and guided through the main plaza, Plaza de la Aduana, to Simon Bolívar Square. Then, for approximately 90 minutes, you're free to explore on your own on foot; or a unique way to see the city is to take a ride in a horse-drawn carriage. As you walk or ride through the picturesque streets, you'll be charmed by terraces entwined with flowers, lush parks and entertaining street musicians.

Declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site the Old City area is comprised of three sections El Centro, where most of the historic buildings are located; San Diego, home to the city's merchant class; and San Pedro, where the nobles and the notables resided.

In the center you will find many attractions such as the Palacio de la Inquisicion, the Inquisition Museum. From the outside, this charming building is a prime example of colonial architecture, but inside, is a museum featuring a spine-chilling collection of instruments of torture from the Spanish Inquisition, as well as artwork from the pre-Columbian, colonial and independence eras.

During the colonial period wealthy merchants of the town once lived in the San Diego neighborhood. Here, you'll discover the Las Bovedas shopping arcade, the School of Fine Arts, the Plaza de Madrid and the legendary Sofitel Hotel Santa Clara, which was originally built in 1621 and known as the Convento de las Clarisas. Nearby is the Plaza de los Coches, where slaves were once bought and sold, and Puerta del Reloj, which was once the main gateway into the walled city.

Two must see churches reside in San Pedro. Construction of the Cartagena Cathedral was begun in 1575 but partially demolished by Sir Francis Drake's cannons. The church and convent of San Pedro Claver was built in the 17th century and displays exquisite statues and old-world furnishings honoring the life and work of missionary Saint Peter Claver, the patron saint of slaves and the first saint canonized in the Western Hemisphere.

After time on your own, you'll meet at the main city entrance where you will re-board your transportation for your return to the ship.

Island Highlights & Beach

This relaxing tour begins with an easy drive through the island's capital, Oranjestad, in your air conditioned bus. Sit back and enjoy the sight of Aruba's colorful markets and many impressive Dutch Colonial buildings, including a short photo-stop in the town's center. You will then drive through Frenchman's Pass, the legendary passage where in the 17th century, invading French pirates were confronted by Indians above the Spanish Lagoon. The last stop of this laid-back tour is at one of the island's beaches. Be sure to wear your swimsuit. You will have approximately 1 hour and 30 minutes to swim in the ocean, stroll along the beach or simply relax.

The lighthouse is named after the "U.S. California" which sunk just off the coast of Aruba in 1893, years before the lighthouse was built. Here, you will have plenty of time to admire the stunning island views and take photographs.

Boarding your transportation, you will continue your drive across the island's arid terrain, viewing cacti and divi-divi trees, known as Aruba's natural compass as they always point in a southwesterly direction. Your guide may also point out iguanas and wild goats, so make sure you have your cameras close to hand at all times. You will continue on to two fascinating rock formations: the ruins of the island's Natural Bridge and the still intact Baby Natural Bridge. The Natural Bridge fell into the sea in 2005, but the smaller bridge, an arch carved out of rock and coral, is a photogenic island highlight.

After freely exploring this fascinating terrain, you will climb back on the transportation for the short drive to the striking Casibari rock formations. Here, giant boulders, some as tall as houses, lie heaped about the landscape, most of which are covered in unique shrubs. Animal lovers will then enjoy a tour of the island's delightful ostrich attraction. Here you will get acquainted with many of these interesting, flightless birds as well as the emu. Although Africa is the native land of the ostrich, this intriguing bird finds a perfect home in Aruba's rugged landscape. The Aruba Ostrich Attraction welcomes you to come and meet its flock of the largest living species in the world. Those of you who are brave enough will have the opportunity to feed them: a handler will supervise the feeding

and you will be advised to removed jewelry and sunglasses.

Certified Scuba Diving & Antilla Shipwreck (Two Sites)





At the cruise terminal, a Red Sail Sports representative will meet you and assist you in completing the necessary waivers. Afterwards, you'll be guided to the dive boat for a 2-tank dive trip. The boat ride to the first dive takes approximately 45 minutes and will be a wreck dive at the "Antilla".

The "Antilla" was a German freighter that was scuttled by its captain during World War II. The "Antilla" is the largest wreck in the Caribbean (400 feet long) and is covered with giant tube sponges and coral formations, surrounded by lobsters and tropical fish. The dive has a depth of 60 feet and the bottom time is approximately 40 minutes. On this dive the group will be split up into smaller groups and guided by a dive master or instructor.

After 20 minutes surface interval, the second dive will take place on the shallow wreck of the "Pedernalis." The ship was an oil tanker torpedoed by a German submarine during World War II. The wreck's several large pieces are spread out between coral formations; making visible the complete wreck cabins, wash basins, and lavatories as well as the tankers pipeline system. The area around the "Pedernalis" is known for its many types of groupers and its bounty of angel fish. The dive has a maximum depth of 25 feet with a bottom time of approximately 35 minutes. Again, on this dive you will be split into the same smaller groups as during your first dive and guided by a dive master or instructor.

4WD Island Tour, Baby Natural Bridge & Arashi Beach



AUA-340 Approximately 4.5 hours / From \$99

Perfect for those who prefer off-road adventures, this four hour excursion showcases all that Aruba has to offer. And as you cross the island, a friendly and informative guide will share his knowledge of the many sights you'll visit and refreshments will be provided during your tour. Because of the often rocky surfaces, uneven roads and narrows paths, this 4WD excursion is not recommended for children under six or those over 350 pounds. It's also a good idea to wear comfortable clothes (don't forget to wear a swimsuit) and bring along sun block, insect repellent and a towel. And remember to bring a camera to capture all the fantastic sights.

After a short ride to the starting point, you'll meet your guide before climbing aboard your 4WD Land Rover vehicle. Then, you'll feel like a true explorer as you take off for Aruba's north and east coasts.

As you travel along you'll notice that the island is dotted with massive diorite boulders that have been wind carved over the centuries to form unusual shapes. One of the most extraordinary is Casibari Rock. This monolithic rock formation is called Aruba's Stonehenge but geologists believe that it's from tectonic plates colliding together. A walk up to the top rewards you with constant breezes and terrific views.

Your next stop is Baby Natural Bridge, one of Aruba's most popular attractions. Pounded over thousands of years by wind and surf, this natural coral limestone bridge is a powerful testament to nature's power. Nearby is another bridge that collapsed in 2005.

Continuing on, you'll stop at the Bushiribana Gold Mine Ruins. Believed by the Spanish in 1499 to hold great hordes of gold, the land was soon abandoned when very little of this precious metal was found. They should have waited about 300 years. In 1824, gold was discovered near a pirate hideaway called Bushiribana. A large smelting plant was built in 1872 and for the next 10 years, it was used to extract gold until it was depleted. Today, the crumbling plant looks almost medieval in its dilapidated appearance.

Then, you'll stop at the picturesque Alto Vista Chapel. Built in 1952 it sits on the same site that occupied the original chapel in 1750. Standing at the tip of the island's northern end is the majestic California Lighthouse. Named for the USS California, which sank in 1893, the lighthouse offers spectacular views from its 98-foot high perch.

Finally, enjoy laid-back swimming in Arashi Beach. Soft, white sands and crystal clear water makes it one of the most popular spots in Aruba.

After your dip, your 4WD will take you through Palm Beach, Eagle Beach and Druif Beach on your back to the drop off point.

Located in the eastern side of the island, you will also visit the Wariruri Natural Bridge a limestone formation that was pounded for thousands of years by waves and wind. After a brief stop, it's time to trot back to the ranch, say good-bye to your faithful ride and head back to the ship.

Wear a swimsuit and bring towel and adequate sun protection. Lockers available for rent in the gift shop. Water park operations start promptly at 10 am, water slides will open at this time. SNUBA upgrade is offered at De Palm Island for a nominal fee with a purchased De Palm Island Beach ticket. Once participants join their tour, they will be required to complete a liability waiver.

UTV Off-Road Adventure

You may think that Aruba's only charms lie in its snow white beaches and glistening turquoise waters but the island's outback is also chock full of jagged cliffs, house sized boulders and eerie ruins. So if you live for adrenaline-pumping, outdoor adventure, this three hour excursion is for you. To make your experience even more enjoyable, be sure to wear sturdy shoes, long pants, sun glasses, a hat and put on sunscreen.

The thrills kick off with a short ride to the UTV main office where you'll meet your knowledgeable guide who will instruct you in how to properly drive your utility task vehicle. Then, you'll grab on to the controls and take off for a two-hour-and-forty-minute ride into Aruba's wild landscape.

Among the sights you'll travel past the spectacular Ayo Rocks. These giant boulders, many as big as a house and weighing several

tons, date back thousands of years.

Revving along, your UTV ventures through the Andicuri trail and past the rugged coastline of the island's northwest corner before stopping to visit the charming Chapel of Alto Vista. Originally constructed in 1750 by the Caiquetio Indians and Spanish settlers, the chapel fell into ruin over the centuries. The sacred structure you see today was built 60 years ago on the chapel's original site. Outside, the charming yellow building is a welcoming landmark situated atop a hill overlooking the ocean. Inside rests an award-winning solid oak, hand carved altar.

Your next stop is the Gold Mine Ruins. Believed by the Spanish in 1499 to hold great hordes of gold, the land was soon abandoned when very little of this precious metal was found. They should have waited about 300 years. In 1824, gold was discovered near a pirate hideaway called Bushiribana. A large smelting plant was built in 1872 and for the next 10 years, it was used to extract gold until it was depleted. Today, the crumbling plant looks almost medieval in its dilapidated appearance.

Continuing on, you'll head to the island's northwestern tip for a look at Aruba's desert. Acres of windswept, white sand dunes studded with large boulders roll up and around the 100-year-old California Lighthouse, named for the USS California, a wooden sailing ship that sank in 1908. Although you can't go inside, you can climb up the hill to the base of the 98-foot-tall stone lighthouse for panoramic views of the western and eastern coastlines.

At the end of your unforgettable journey, you'll turn your UTV around and head back to your ship in Oranjestad and enjoy the rest of your day before boarding.

Semi-Submarine, Shipwreck & Island Drive

Your tour begins when you board the ferry "Stingray" at Palm Pier, on one of Aruba's best beaches. After a 20-minute transfer, you'll board the semi-sub. This is a surface vessel where you sit five feet below the waterline, the perfect way to discover the fascinating sea life that lives in these crystal clear Caribbean waters. The semi-sub will head towards the wreck of the "Antilla," a German freighter that was sunk off the coast of Aruba during World War II. The tour is narrated and you will learn about how this 440-foot-long freighter met its watery end. You will also be able to view coral and the plentiful sea life, before returning to dry land. Here you will board your air-conditioned transportation for the short yet scenic journey to the California Lighthouse for views of Aruba's windward

The lighthouse is named after the U.S. ship which sunk in 1893, years before the lighthouse was built. Your captivating day then continues as you drive to the Casibari rock formations, where you will have time to browse the gift shop and view the amazing landscape formed by diorite boulders the size of small houses. Energetic guests may wish to climb the 80 rustic steps to the formation's summit for stunning views of the island. Finally, it's time to head to Aruba's rugged north coast, to view the breath-taking Baby Natural Bridge, carved by the surf from solid coral and limestone. You will also be able to view the collapsed original Natural Bridge, and visit the gift shop here. Your route back to the ship takes you past the fascinating ruins of a 19th-century gold mill at Boca Mahos, and at the end of the tour, you will have the option to independently explore Aruba's capital city Oranjestad. You will then be responsible for your return to the ship, which is a mere five minute walk away.

You will also discover the many colorful fish that inhabit these waters. To help you identify the different breeds of fish, you will have the use of an 'exotic fish chart' that is attached to your seat. The experienced captain and crew will point out many wonderful watery sights during the trip, and after your voyage you will receive a certificate as proof of your participation in a real life submarine excursion. Now that's something to show the folks back home!

- Stay in the normal tourist areas and don't travel to out-of the way places without the benefit of a guided tour offered through Princess.
- Do not leave any of your belongings unattended in public areas.
- Be generally aware of people and activities around you.
- Do not accept packages from anyone you don't know personally.
- Keep a low profile dress and behave conservatively.
- Be careful when eating and drinking ashore.

Q. WILL I MISS THE SHIP IF I GO ON A SHORE EXCURSION?

A. One very important feature of taking a shore excursion organized by Princess is that we closely monitor the departures and returns of all our tours. Therefore, our ships do not sail until all of our organized tour transportation has returned, so you can be assured that you won't miss the ship. Please keep in mind that when you make your own arrangements in port, or if you leave an organized tour, we will no longer be aware of your whereabouts; so be sure to schedule ample time to return to the ship before it sails.

Q. HOW DO I RESERVE MY SHORE EXCURSIONS IN ADVANCE OF MY CRUISE?

A. Visit our website at princess.com for the most up-to date shore excursion information, full tour descriptions and to request your shore excursions up until 5 days prior to your cruise. The Cruise Personalizer is the fastest and most convenient way to reserve your shore excursions. Please keep in mind that you will receive your tickets when you arrive onboard and all of your shore excursion purchases are charged to your shipboard account. Advance payment is not accepted. Since shore excursions have limited capacity, we encourage you to reserve your tours as early as possible to avoid disappointment and confirm the best price. Reservations are processed on a first-come, first-served basis.

You may change shore excursion requests, but be advised that shore excursion prices may change. Requests to add tickets at a later time can be made but these tickets may be at a higher price than those previously booked. If you request a shore excursion which you previously cancelled, these requests will be confirmed at the current shore excursion price, which may be higher.

Q. HOW DO I RESERVE MY LAND EXCURSIONS IN ADVANCE OF MY CRUISETOUR?

A. When you are ready to pre-reserve your land excursions, go to the Cruise Personalizer and have your booking number and credit card information ready to enter. A credit card must be registered for each passenger that wishes to participate on a land excursion and we accept Princess Visa, Visa, MasterCard, American Express, Discover and Diner's Club. Credit cards used to pre-reserve land excursions must be valid through the full length of your cruisetour and may also be used to establish your shipboard account. Although a credit card is required to reserve your excursion(s), quests are able to pre-reserve all of their land excursions with no deposit required. An auto-charge of all pre-reserved excursions will take place two days prior to your first Land Excursion booking. Confirmed pre-reserved excursions can be viewed at any time in your detailed itinerary in the Cruise Personalizer. The Cruise Personalizer will remain open until your cruisetour departure date so you may add or cancel tours prior to the cancellation deadline without penalty. Excursions cancelled once the auto-charge has been processed are subject to a 100% penalty. Note that excursion availability is based on cruisetour date, capacity limitations, and suitable weather conditions. Excursions are subject to change at any time and available on a first-come, first-serve basis. Guests are encouraged to book early as space is limited and flightseeing tours in particular may not be available for pre-reserving right up to tour departure date. Prior to travel, print your Travel Summary which will have a listing of all of your pre-reserved land excursions. You will also receive information on confirmed excursions in your Welcome Envelope upon arrival at each location.

Q. HOW CAN I BE SURE I AM CONFIRMED ON THE EXCURSIONS I WANT?

A. When you book your excursions online at princess.com, you receive an immediate confirmation of the status and price of your requested excursion. The site shows the remaining capacity on all tours, so you know if you are confirmed or waitlisted. To avoid disappointment and confirm the best price, please reserve your excursions as early as possible. If the specific tour time you requested is fully booked, Princess may schedule you on an alternate departure that corresponds with your other tour selections.

If your shore excursion choice is not available, we will put you on a waitlist and attempt to obtain more space on the shore excursion. If you have companions traveling with you in your stateroom or in other staterooms and would like everyone to be on the same shore excursion departure, order all the excursions under one name. Requests made individually, even if at the same time, may cause you to be booked on a different departure than your companions or waitlisted on an excursion for which your companions are confirmed.

Land Excursions can not be waitlisted but we actively request more space wherever possible from our tour operators; if a tour is sold out we encourage guests to revisit the Cruise Personalizer at a later date and they can also check for more availability at the tour desks in our Alaska ports.

Q. MAY I TAKE MORE THAN ONE TOUR IN A SINGLE PORT OF CALL?

A. Yes. In Alaska, Canada/New England, the Caribbean, Panama Canal, Hawaii and Mexico, allow at least 30 minutes between each tour. In all other regions, allow at least 60 minutes between each tour. All tours depart from, and return to, the cruise ship pier. By scheduling the appropriate amount of time between tours, you will have sufficient time to take multiple excursions.

Q. CAN I CANCEL AN SHORE EXCURSION I'VE REQUESTED?

A. Due to the limited capacity and high demand for helicopter flights and private vehicle options, these shore excursions are not refundable unless cancelled by 12:00pm on the day after embarkation.

For all other shore excursions, a "Closing Time for Bookings" for each port of call is listed on the Tour Order Form you will receive onboard in your stateroom. This is the time when the bookings for the tours in that port close and we notify the local operators of the final shore excursion requirements. You may cancel an excursion if it is prior to the closing time whether you reserved in advance or onboard. We cannot cancel a shore excursion if it is past this closing time, nor can we refund shore excursions on which you choose not to go. All shore excursions operate rain or shine unless cancelled by the tour operator.

Q. CAN I CANCEL A LAND EXCURSION I'VE REQUESTED?

A. Due to the exclusive nature and advanced planning required for excursions involving hotel accommodations, airline flights and some flightseeing tours, these excursions are not refundable within 30 days of sailing. A fee will be assessed onboard for any of these tours cancelled within 30 days of sailing.

Land Excursions, pre-reserved through the Cruise Personalizer, may be cancelled up to the Land Excursion cancellation deadline which is two days prior to your first land excursion booking. At the cancellation deadline, all pre-reserved land excursions will be auto-charged using the credit card that you provided in the Cruise Personalizer to reserve your tours. Excursions cancelled once the auto-charge has been processed are subject to a 100% penalty, unless the operator, at their sole discretion, is unable to operate the program due to unforeseen circumstances. All sales of tours booked while on your land tour are considered final at the time of purchase and are 100% non-refundable except in the case of an operator approved cancellation.

Q. CAN I REQUEST TO BE REFUNDED FOR MY LAND EXCURSION.

A. In the event of any excursion being cancelled for reasons beyond our control, a full refund will be made. Land

Excursions that were pre-reserved, charged and then cancelled due to weather or other operator approved cancellation will be refunded using the same credit card used to book your excursions. These refunds will typically be reflected on your credit card statement between 7-10 business days after cancellation. Tours booked while on your land tour are considered final at the time of purchase and are 100% non-refundable except in the case of a cancellation by the vendor. Should any excursion have to be abandoned through force majeure or difficulties en route, the best possible refund will be arranged according to the circumstances.

Q. HOW DOES THE PRINCESS EXCURSIONS PROGRAM OPERATE ONBOARD?

A. Our Shore Excursion Manager runs the onboard portion of the Princess Shore Excursions program. Tour Office staff are available to answer questions and make shore excursion reservations for you. Once onboard in your stateroom, you will find tickets for the shore excursions you reserved in advance. If you have not yet reserved tours or would like to purchase additional shore excursions, you will find a Tour Order Form in your stateroom. You will also find a schedule of daily activities, the Princess Patter, which features important program information including Tour Office hours and the closing time for shore excursion bookings. Remember, tickets are sold on a first-come, first-served basis and space on shore excursions is limited, so book early. A Tour Order Form drop box is located near the Tour Office where you may deposit your order form at any time.

Q. ARE THERE CHILDREN'S PRICES AVAILABLE?

A. Yes, on some tours for children age 12 and under. If you are traveling with children, please pre-reserve the number of child tickets you would like on the Cruise Personalizer. If the adult and child price is the same, please order all tickets as adult. Once onboard the ship or at one of our land excursion destinations, check your tour tickets to ensure you have received the correct number of adult and child tickets. Visit the Tour Office as soon as possible to make any necessary adjustments. Parents are also responsible for bringing a safety seat for their child.

On most helicopter and flightseeing tours, children 24 months of age and older are required to have their own seat. Children under 24 months are considered lap infants and may ride free of charge if the tour operator can accommodate them - with prior arrangement through the onboard Tour Office. Parents must show proof of age to the tour operator for any lap infant. Children under the age of 24 months are not able to participate on a helicopter tour.

Q. ARE PRIVATE SHORE EXCURSION OPTIONS AVAILABLE WHERE I CAN CUSTOMIZE MY TOUR?

A. Yes, in many ports we offer shore excursions that can be customized to your specifications. On these tours you are able to book exclusive use of the tour vehicle (automobile, boat or plane) and tailor the tour to include activities and venues you want to experience.

Due to the limited capacity and highly specialized nature of these excursions, they are not refundable unless cancelled by 12:00pm on the day after embarkation or prior to the booking closing time for the port which is listed on the onboard Tour Order Form (whichever is first). Once onboard the ship, you may be provided with a preference card to advise the tour operator of your selected itinerary and interests. The onboard Tour Staff will gladly assist you and provide recommendations.

Please note these shore excursions are sold per transport, not per person, so only one passenger should make the reservation for the entire group. This is a private arrangement and those accompanying you are the guests you choose; Princess does not match up individual passengers to form a private group for the vehicle. The price listed includes the means of transport and/or private guide and does not include gratuities, meals and attraction entrance fees (unless indicated otherwise) as these will vary based on your choices.

Q. ARE THERE AGE OR OTHER RESTRICTIONS ON TOURS?

A. For most tours, there is no minimum age for children as long as they are accompanied by a parent or guardian. Passengers under the age of 18 years cannot participate without a parent or guardian. Please review the tour description notes for the most current restrictions and any exceptions; a few operators may allow an unaccompanied minor on tour if a wavier is signed by the parent or guardian in the operator's presence. Any other restrictions imposed by the tour operator are listed in the "Special Notes" section of each tour description.

Q. IS A VISA REQUIRED FOR ANY OF THE PORTS I VISIT?

A. Please review the information detailed in the "Itinerary" section of the Cruise Personalizer regarding any applicable visas for your specific voyage.

Q. IS ANY ADDITIONAL DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED TO PARTICIPATE ON SHORE EXCURSIONS?

A. Passports, visas and other documentation may be required on certain shore excursions. Please review the "Special Notes" section of the shore excursion for full details. Notarized written consent is required for children crossing international borders without both parents.

Q. ARE THE EXCURSIONS GUIDED?

A. Yes. All of our excursions include local English-speaking guides except for On Your Own tours and where otherwise noted.

Q. SHOULD I TIP THE TOUR GUIDE?

A. Tipping is a discretionary matter; however, it is customary, if one is pleased with their tour, to tip the tour guide. A

general rule of thumb is \$2 per person for a half-day tour and \$5 per person for a full-day tour.

Q. WHAT TYPE OF CLOTHING SHOULD I WEAR WHILE ON TOUR OR IN PORT?

A. During your cruise, the climate can range from temperate and cool to hot and humid. Please plan to dress in layered, light- to medium-weight clothing and comfortable, low-heeled walking shoes. Since weather conditions may vary, we suggest you also pack a sweater, a light jacket and an all-weather coat. In addition, don't forget a hat or visor, a collapsible umbrella, sunglasses, sun screen and of course your camera and extra film and batteries. Please note that for water-related excursions where we suggest you wear your bathing suit, cover-up and hat, we have placed a symbol next to the shore excursion description.

If you plan to participate on an overland tour and will need to recharge video equipment or use a hair dryer, we suggest you bring an international adapter. Whenever you plan on going ashore, we highly encourage you to leave your valuables and jewelry onboard. While ashore, please take care in protecting your purses, cameras and other personal items. Minimizing personal belongings brought ashore could expedite the security process when reboarding the ship. We suggest you carry a photocopy of your passport when going ashore as you may need your passport number to exchange currency.

Please be mindful that in some of the countries you will visit, the local people may have somewhat more conservative views concerning dress than those to which you are accustomed. Generally shorts, tank tops, and short skirts are not acceptable dress when visiting churches or places of worship. Specific information regarding appropriate dress in these ports is provided with the shore excursion. For all golf tours, collared shirts and either long pants or Bermuda-style shorts are required (no cut-offs, bathing suits, etc.).

Q. WILL I MISS MEALS IF I GO ON SHORE EXCURSIONS?

A. Our wide variety of dining venues, including a 24-hour buffet, means there are always meal options available onboard that fit within the shore excursion timing you select.

Q. IS THERE TIME FOR SHOPPING ON THE EXCURSIONS?

A. Shopping is, for many, an important part of travel and, wherever possible, time for this activity is allowed within the framework of many of our shore excursions. Please note, however, that the actual amount of time available for shopping is generally limited.

Q. DO THE EXCURSIONS INCLUDE MUCH WALKING AND STAIR CLIMBING?

A. All of our excursions involve some walking and some excursions include more walking and stair climbing than others. Walking may be over uneven surfaces such as cobblestone city streets or the rocky pathways of ancient ruins. On many excursions, it is necessary to negotiate stairs. Please keep in mind that many of the buildings you will be visiting may have been constructed well before conveniences such as elevators were invented and have been preserved in their original state. Please refer to our tour symbols with each excursion description for more information and guidance.

Q. WHAT ELSE SHOULD I ANTICIPATE IN PORTS?

A. Keep in mind that some sites you will be visiting are extremely popular among both tourists and locals. Therefore, you may encounter crowded conditions, whether participating in one of our tours or sightseeing on your own. Regrettably, we have no control over this situation. With regard to photography, some venues may prohibit the use of flash cameras, so fast-speed film is recommended. In some places, photography or video may be prohibited altogether or a fee may be imposed. We ask that you observe any restrictions and, if in doubt, ask your guide for assistance.

Q. AM I REQUIRED TO WEAR SAFETY EQUIPMENT ON TOUR?

A. Yes, on certain tours it is mandatory that you wear the appropriate safety equipment in order to participate. Such equipment includes, but is not limited to snorkel vests, life vests, helmets, etc.

Q. WHAT IS REQUIRED TO PARTICIPATE IN A CERTIFIED DIVE TOUR?

A. An open-water scuba certification card must be presented in order to participate in a certified dive tour. Unfortunately, we are unable to accommodate divers with either a Junior Open Water or a Scuba Diver rating due to the depth limitations imposed by these certifications. The sport-diving industry recommends that divers take an update course if they have not been diving within the last six months. Please note that some dive operators may reserve the right to refuse to take divers who cannot provide proof of the date of their last dive or scuba review course. We recommend you bring a log book or proof that you have recently completed a review course.

There are certain medical conditions that may prevent your participation. Accordingly, you will be required to complete a medical-history form and liability waiver/release form that will be supplied onboard or by the tour operator. Following is a non-inclusive list of several medical conditions that may prevent you from safely participating in scuba diving. Any of these conditions would also require an examination prior to your cruise by a qualified physician to obtain written permission to participate in scuba diving activities. Heart disease or previous heart attack, diabetes, epilepsy or seizures, high blood pressure or the need to take medication to control blood pressure, pregnancy, asthma or any form of lung disease, recent surgery, blackouts, sinus problems, fear of closed spaces, recurring complicated migraines headaches, recurrent ear problems, severe motion sickness and presently taking prescription

Following is a non-inclusive list of several medical conditions that may prevent you from safely participating in scuba diving. Any of these conditions would also require an examination prior to your cruise by a qualified physician to obtain written permission to participate in scuba diving activities. Heart disease or previous heart attack, diabetes, epilepsy or seizures, high blood pressure or take medicine to control blood pressure, presently taking prescription medicines with the exception of birth control, pregnancy, asthma or any form of lung disease, recent surgery, blackouts, sinus problems, fear of closed spaces, recurring complicated migraine headaches, recurrent ear problems, and severe motion sickness. Following is a non-inclusive list of several medical conditions that may prevent you from safely participating in scuba diving. Any of these conditions would also require an examination prior to your cruise by a qualified physician to obtain written permission to participate in scuba diving activities. Heart disease or previous heart attack, diabetes, epilepsy or seizures, high blood pressure or take medicine to control blood pressure, presently taking prescription medicines with the exception of birth control, pregnancy, asthma or any form of lung disease, recent surgery, blackouts, sinus problems, fear of closed spaces, recurring complicated migraine headaches, recurrent ear problems, and severe motion sickness. For helmet or SNUBA tours there is a minimum age of 8 years and passengers must weigh at least 75 pounds. For underwater scooter tours there is a minimum age of 10.

Q. ON SPORTFISHING EXCURSIONS, DO I GET TO KEEP THE FISH I CATCH?

A. Most sportfishing tours offered by Princess are part of a catch-and-release program. Fish that are edible and not endangered are typically landed and kept by the boat crew. Please remember you have purchased an opportunity to catch fish, not a guarantee of doing so. As one of our boat captains said, "We guarantee fishing, not catching."

In Alaska only, if your tour is not designated as catch and release, your catch can be processed and shipped home for an additional charge as arranged by the tour operator. Because of its perishable nature and U.S. Customs regulations, your catch may not be sent outside of the United States in most cases. Due to federal regulations, your catch may not be stored onboard the ship, but may be prepared for dinner onboard. Fish caught while at our lodges in Alaska, needs to be shipped home if not part of a catch-and-release program. In Alaska, fishing licenses are required and can be purchased on your boat for \$20 per person in cash (rates subject to change). Fishing for king salmon requires an additional \$10 retention tag (rates subject to change). Children under 16 do not need a license. Fish runs are dependent on spawning seasons, so during May and late-September fish stock may be more limited. Go to www.adfg.state.ak.us for more details on licensing requirements and fishing regulations in Alaska.

Q. WHAT SHOULD I KNOW BEFORE TAKING A HELICOPTER TOUR?

A. Due to weight and balance limitations, as well as passenger safety and comfort, the helicopter excursion companies have advised that passengers weighing 250 pounds or more (fully clothed) will be assessed a surcharge to reserve adequate space onboard the helicopter. The surcharge amount will be indicated in the "Special Notes" section of each tour.

Because of the limited capacity and high demand for helicopter tours, they are not refundable unless cancelled by 12:00pm on the day after embarkation. Children 24 months of age and older are required to have their own seat. Children under 24 months are considered lap infants and may ride free of charge if the tour operator can accommodate them - with prior arrangement through the onboard Tour Office. Parents must show proof of age to the tour operator for any lap infant.

Carry-on bags are not allowed and limited secure storage is provided at the heliport. Helicopters may carry up to six guests depending on combined group weight. The flight length is approximate and flight route may vary due to weather conditions. Helicopter tours may be cancelled on short notice due to weather or safety issues. Warm clothing and sunglasses are recommended on helicopter tours. Dressing in layers is practical and lets you adjust your attire to meet changing conditions.

For helicopter tours in Denali National Park, a surcharge is not charged for guest over 250lbs. The helicopter company will assign aircraft and seats based on weight and balance. While every consideration is made to keep traveling companions and/or families together, this is not always possible for safety reasons.

Q. DOES PRINCESS OWN THE TOUR COMPANIES IN THE PORTS?

A. No, all of the shore excursions are operated by local, independent companies not by Princess; Princess retains a

portion of the total sale. We selected only the most reputable companies available to provide your excursions. The companies providing your excursions are selected by Princess based on their excellent reputation for service and safety.

Q. WHAT DO YOU RECOMMEND FOR PHYSICALLY CHALLENGED PASSENGERS?

A. Our answer, of course, depends on the type and degree of the disability. The goal of Princess Cruises is to provide a safe comfortable cruise experience for all passengers. If you will be using a mobility device during your sailing we strongly recommend you travel with a person physically fit to assist with your needs both onboard and ashore.

If passengers are able to walk on their own, we recommend tours designated as requiring a moderate level of activity. The transport on some tours may be able to accommodate a collapsible wheelchair stored below the bus; scooters or motorized wheelchairs are often too large. If confined to a wheelchair, we would recommend reserving the excursions identified as wheelchair accessible (see Tour Symbols listed for each tour) or a private vehicle shore excursion. We also recommend that non-ambulatory passengers be accompanied by someone who is able to assist them throughout the duration of their day. Our Tour Staff can provide more information on touring options for non-ambulatory guests. Physically challenged passengers participating on a shore excursion must contact the Tour Office at least 48 hours prior to your excursion to ensure arrangements can be made to meet your particular needs.

Embarking and disembarking can be challenging for those with limited mobility. Many major ports of call provide easy access for wheelchairs and scooters. However due to various conditions: steepness of the gangway, weather, shoreside facilities and tidal and sea conditions, passengers using mobility devices may be required to transfer to a stair climber or be precluded from going ashore. Princess staff will make every effort to assist but are not allowed to individually physically lift more than 50 pounds (22 kg).

Some ports of call require the ship to anchor off shore. Passengers are then taken to shore by small boats or tenders. When tendering is required, passengers using mobility devices will not be transferred into or out of the tender, if lifting in excess of the above limitation is required. Many tender ports do not provide wheelchair access so even if the passenger can board the tender they may not be able to disembark ashore. Again the shoreside facilities, movement of the tender, weather and tidal conditions can also preclude tendering.

The decision to allow any passenger to board a tender or disembark the vessel will be made by the Captain on the basis of the safety and welfare of all involved and is final. If passengers are unable to tender or disembark because of circumstances outlined above there will be no refund or credit for missed ports. While Princess recognizes your disappointment the safety of both passengers and crew takes precedence.

For more information on the terms and conditions for Princess Shore Excursions, please refer to the Special Information section. Every effort will be made to accommodate all passengers on the tour of their choice but, tours are operated by independent local companies and not by Princess. The final determination to let any passenger participate is made by the tour operator and therefore if, in the judgment of the tour operator, the safety or comfort of any passenger is in question, guests may be denied participation. This evaluation may not be able to be determined until meeting directly with the local tour operator.

Special Information

CONDITIONS In selling tickets (including coupons or vouchers) or otherwise promoting or making arrangements for Excursions— whether for air, land or local water transportation; tours; sports or any other recreational activities; shore accommodations or meals or for any service, facility or activity other than onboard Princess' cruise ships — Princess acts only as agent for the independent tour operator supplying such excursions or services. Participation by a passenger in Excursions is conditioned upon such passenger's acceptance of the terms and conditions set forth in the Passage Contract contained in the Cruise Ticket, the Excursion Ticket and, depending on the activity, other documents which, among other things, expressly release Princess from any liability for such participation. Participation may also be subject to the independent tour operators' own terms and conditions.

EXCURSION TIMINGS Departure times for each tour will be listed on princess.com in the Cruise Personalizer. For Shore Excursions, they will also be listed on the Tour Order Form, which you will receive onboard. These have been published according to information from our Tour Operators, but are subject to change should the vessel's arrival time at any port be delayed, or the itinerary for any particular excursion be amended. Please note that the time shown will be the time the last tour vehicle leaves the pier or hotel. Passengers are requested to report to the specified departure location (either onboard ship or shoreside) at the designated time, as delay on your part can interfere with the pleasure of your fellow passengers.

EXCURSIONS WITH LIMITED PARTICIPATION Shore Excursions may be purchased in advance of your cruise departure or onboard ship on a first-come, first served basis. Many of our excursions have limited participation and reservation requests will be processed in the order received. When excursions are fully subscribed, additional requests will be placed on a waiting list in the order received. Land Excursions can not be waitlisted but we actively request more space wherever possible from our tour operators; if a tour is sold out we encourage guests to revisit the Cruise Personalizer at a later date and they can also check for more availability at the tour desks in our Alaska ports.

PERSONAL POSSESSIONS Coats, wraps, umbrellas, cameras, handbags, traveling bags and similar personal articles remain at all times through the tour under the passenger's custody and control. Be careful that you do not leave your possessions unattended at any time in the car or coach in which you are traveling.

PRICES The prices for Excursions are subject to change without notice; are per adult, per child or in some cases per vehicle. Prices are confirmed at the time of booking. All quotations made include conveyance according to the itinerary and, where applicable, meals, refreshments, guides and entrance fees, unless otherwise stated. Children, other than infants in arms, will be charged full fare unless noted otherwise.

SHOPPING Where possible, time for shopping has been allowed within the framework of some excursions. However, excursions are not primarily designed for shopping, and time allowed for this purpose may be limited.

REFUNDS No refunds can be made on any ticket, coupon or voucher unless notice of cancellation is given before the closing date indicated on the booking form for the excursions involved. The times when bookings will close will be published onboard. In the event of any excursion being canceled for reasons beyond our control, a full refund will be made. However, should any excursion have to be abandoned through force majeure or difficulties en route, the best possible refund will be arranged according to the circumstances. Land Excursions that were pre-reserved, charged and then cancelled due to weather or other operator approved cancellation will be refunded using the same credit card used to book your excursions. These refunds will typically be reflected on your credit card statement between 7-10 business days after cancellation. Tours booked while on your land tour are considered final at the time of purchase and are 100% non-refundable except in the case of a cancellation by the vendor.

TRANSPORTATION Passengers should appreciate that standards of transport vary considerably throughout the world. Air-conditioned coaches are not available in many areas, and in some, local buses are the best available. Cars or taxis are also used at some ports where coach or bus transportation is not available or limited. Passengers wishing to travel with friends should all leave the ship together, as this will help the Tour Staff to allocate them space in the same vehicle. For the comfort of all passengers, smoking is prohibited aboard all sightseeing vehicles.

WITHDRAWAL OF TOURS The Tour Operator reserves the right to withdraw any excursion through lack of demand and to make any alterations that they may deem advisable for the comfort of the passengers, bearing in mind the convenience and best interest of each group.

ECOLOGY & ENVIRONMENT. It is our policy to maintain a positive and proactive position in relation to the environment. We realize that there is much work to be done to achieve our company goals. To this end we are continually striving to increase awareness of any environmental issues that are likely to affect any of the excursions we offer. We work closely with our local agents to convey any environmental messages in our shore excursion programs and therefore ask you to support us in our efforts by respecting the cultures, customs and environmental issues of the various destinations we visit.
