Ft. Lauderdale, Florida

According to the popular 1960 beach movie, Fort Lauderdale is "where the boys are." The city's reputation as America's Spring Break capital, however, has been replaced with the more favorable image of a prime family tourist destination, attracting more than 10 million visitors annually. The most popular beach resort in Florida is even more rightly famed as the "Yachting Capital of the World," with more than 40,000 registered crafts calling its waters home. The city also prides itself on being the "Venice of America" with more than 300 miles of navigable waterways. Fort Lauderdale boasts world-class theaters, museums, sightseeing, and shopping.

The city sits 24 miles north of Miami and is named after a series of forts built by the United States during the second Seminole War. The forts took their name from Major William Lauderdale, who was the commander of the detachment of soldiers who built the first fort. Look hard and you might find remnants of three of them today. More people seem to be interested in taking a water tour aboard the "Carrie B."

Note: Upon disembarkation, please collect your bag, go through customs and handle your bag to your tour driver who will stow and lock it underneath your bus. Disembarkation tours end at the airports; therefore passengers who have post-cruise packages at local hotels must disembark at Fort Lauderdale International Airport. South Beach, Miami, Scenic Drive & Miami Airport Transfer (Disembarkation)

Stop at celebrated South Beach, the first section of Miami Beach to be developed in the beginning of the 20th century. Once you arrive, you'll enjoy a brief scenic drive by the world renowned Art Deco Historic District including Ocean Drive and Collins Avenue comprising one of the largest areas in the U.S. on the National Register of Historic Places. Some of the architectural gems you may see include the Avalon, the Breakwater Hotel, the Colony Hotel, and many other architectural gems. Here you will have ample time on your own for lunch at one of the many restaurants, shop and to simply enjoy the unique ambiance of South Beach.

Next on your itinerary you'll drive across the Causeway with the Miami skyline straight ahead. A look to your left and you'll see Dodge Island, home to the Port of Miami, one of the largest cruise ship ports in the world.

Make your way into Miami for a sightseeing tour. Some of the colorful attractions you'll see include Brickell Avenue. As the financial center of Miami, it's considered to be one of the world's most prestigious streets. Continuing on, you'll pass through Coconut Grove; almost 200 years old, this small village of 20,000 is Miami's oldest neighborhood.

Next, is a lovely drive through the tree lined streets of Coral Gables, one of the country's first fully planned communities. Developed in a Mediterranean style, the town boasts many beautiful buildings built during the 1920's including the impressive Biltmore Hotel.

Catch a glimpse of "Little Havana" before your short transfer to Miami International Airport.

St. Kitts, St. Kitts & Nevis

Jagged volcanoes soaring above azure and turquoise seas, dense rainforests in myriad shades of green, rolling fields of sugarcane--welcome to St. Kitts. Along with its neighbor, Nevis, St. Kitts presents an exotic landscape more common to Polynesia than the Caribbean. The islands' terrain, rich soil, and climate made them ideal locations for raising sugarcane. In fact, St. Kitts and Nevis were once the crown jewels of the Caribbean. During the 17th and 18th centuries, Spain, France and England vied for control of the islands, with the English finally winning out in 1787. Today, British and French heritage is evident on both islands. Basseterre, the capital of St. Kitts, boasts fine, restored colonial buildings. Impressive Brimstone Hill Fortress, called the "Gibraltar of the West Indies," is one of the most impressive fortresses in the Caribbean.

Brimstone Hill, Romney Manor & Caribelle Batik

Discover the wonders of St. Kitts throughout this moderately active half-day excursion. Sit back and take in stunning views of Basseterre, the island's capital, through the window of your air-conditioned transport, then get out and explore historic sites on foot. Begin by traveling the scenic coastal road to Brimstone Hill Fortress National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Commanding an 800-foot-high plateau, this 300-year-old fortification offers sweeping views of forested mountains, cultivated fields, and idyllic islands.

Step inside the walls and surround yourself with reminders of the 18th century. The second-largest fortress of its type in the Western Hemisphere, Brimstone Hill was the scene of more battles between the British and French than any other single site in history. It conjures the ingenious British military engineers who designed the fort, the stalwart African slaves who built it and the intrepid soldiers who defended it during the Great Siege of 1782; a battle that was only fully resolved when the Treaty of Versailles was signed in 1783.

Say good-bye to Brimstone Hill and continue your adventure to Caribelle Batik Studios. Feast your eyes on the lush tropical gardens, including the 350-year-old saman tree whose massive limbs shade a half-acre of Romney Manor's landscaped grounds. Enter the studios and see for yourself how Caribelle's signature fabrics are made. During a demonstration, you'll learn how island artisans have adapted the ancient Indonesian method of batik to their own Caribbean designs. Afterwards, visit the shop and purchase a lovely batik garment as a memento of your trip.

The history of Romney Manor adds more local color. The great-great grandfather of Thomas Jefferson is credited with the founding of the estate but it is Earl Romney and his humanistic act that captures the imagination. It was here in 1834 that Romney freed all his slaves, despite the prevailing views.

Soak up your last views of this tranquil spot before re-boarding your transport back to the ship. The stunning coastal road passes emerald-green sugar fields and offers views of the extinct Mt. Liamuiga, an integral part of your overall experience.

This charming capital of the Federation of Saint Kitts and Nevis is one of the oldest towns in the Eastern Caribbean. Founded in 1627 by the French, it served as the capital of the French colony of St. Christophe, eventually growing into a vibrant merchant port.

As you drive through town, your driver will point out landmarks like Independence Square, St. George's Anglican Church, the Berkeley Memorial, and the Queen Victoria Statue Roundabout. Large international banks abound making Basseterre a thriving commercial center.

Your excursion will then go to Romney Manor to witness its splendid gardens which are not only rich in beauty, but have an awesome and fascinating history. Many years ago, these gardens were home of the Carib Indians and were later owned by Sam Jefferson, the great-great-grandfather of Thomas Jefferson, the third President of the United States. Artisans at the Caribelle Batik Factory provide live demonstrations of the complicated process of turning soft Sea Island cotton into a colorful batik.

Soon your tour will head into the surrounding hills for a fantastic overview of the city and photo stop at Timothy Hill Lookout. Travel through "sugar country" and learn about the history of the sugarcane industry and its importance to the island economy. Continue down the island's Southeast Peninsula for views of Frigate Bay, the beach-laden heart of the island's tourist industry. You may even get a look at St. Kitts' sister island, Nevis, in the distance before your return drive back to the ship.



Then, your guide will meet you for an exhilarating walk along a pleasant, looped trail that takes you deep into the cool rainforest, providing commentary on the native flora and fauna. Marvel at the rich biodiversity of this well wooded area. See coconut palms, Poinciana's, and palmettos as well as lemon trees, bougainvillea, hibiscus, tamarind and more.

Enjoy the sounds of nature in this Garden of Eden, the low murmur of running water pierced by the call of a forest bird or a black faced vervet monkey. At the end of your walk, enjoy a selection of homemade local fruit juices, fresh seasonal fruit, pastries, and spring water. Before you leave Romney Gardens, be sure to stand under the huge 350-year-old saman tree that defies description.

Today this beautiful island welcomes visitors drawn to its exotic tropical landscape, superb beaches, crystalline waters, and colorful marine life.





Cross over gully via the Molasses Bridge. Constructed 250 years ago with limestone boulders held together by the mortar of molasses and egg whites, it is one of the strongest spans in Barbados.

Travel through Joe's River Forest featuring 85 acres of lush, towering trees, including the famed bearded figs which gave Barbados its name. With the imposing cliffs on one side and the picturesque Atlantic Ocean on the other, this site is a nature lover's paradise! Stop at the ruggedly beautiful Bathsheba Beach where waves, wind and time have conspired to sculpt giant mushroom shaped rock formations that jut majestically out of the pounding surf; the largest of which, the Bathsheba Rock, sits slightly off shore. Enjoy a complimentary beverage at Barclay's Park, a 50 acre hillside park on the east coast of the island. This lovely park overlooks the scenic Cattlewash Hill, named for the cattle that can be seen wading into the sea there! 



Your one hour off-road adventure is the eco-friendliest way to soak up the exquisite sights of the island's northeastern beaches. With

Sunbury Plantation, Orchid World & Gun Hill Signal





Begin your leisurely excursion to enjoy the best of Barbados by stepping aboard your air-conditioned transportation at the pier. You will depart Bridgetown and take a brief scenic drive through the breathtaking natural beauty of this exotic coral island. Travel to St. George parish and visit the historic Gun Hill Station. Built in 1818, this military outpost with magnificent views of the island once served as a lookout for approaching ships. Using semaphore flags and lanterns, soldiers based here could communicate with other signal stations on the island to warn of possible invasions. Beautifully restored and landscaped by the Barbados National Trust, the station now houses a fascinating collection of military memorabilia and features an imposing statue of a magnificent lion, carved from coral in 1868 by garrison captain Henry Wilkinson.

Venture to the heart of the Barbadian countryside with a stop at Orchid World, an exotically beautiful 6-acre tropical garden that is home to over 5,000 orchids. Situated amongst fields of softly swaying sugarcane, this glorious wonder of nature features a meandering path that takes you past gently flowing waterfalls, through coral grottos, along rock gardens and into cool, shady gullies. Marvel at the orchids that abound throughout, some of which grow in mid-air on freestanding palisades with their roots completely free of any soil! Enjoy the tranquility of four shaded orchid houses, a fernery, two courtyards and a gazebo with spectacular vistas of the surrounding landscape.

Step back into the past with a trip to the Sunbury Plantation House, located in tranquil St. Philip parish. Built in 1650 by Matthew Chapman, an Irish/English planter who was one of the island's first settlers, this beautifully restored house is a monument to plantation life of a bygone era. Coast to Coast Scenic Drive & Vistas





Indulge in the highlights of Barbados in a leisurely and relaxing way. You'll begin your excursion by boarding air-conditioned transportation at the pier. Accompanied by a friendly and knowledgeable guide you'll travel through the busy, winding streets of Bridgetown. Located in the parish of St. Michael, Bridgetown was founded in 1628 by British settlers who originally named it "Indian Bridge" for the rope bridge which had been constructed over the river by the Arawaks, indigenous people to the Caribbean. Have your cameras at the ready as you take in the sights which include the House of Parliament, established in 1639. Featuring a beautiful clock tower, this majestic building houses the second oldest parliament in the entire commonwealth. Opposite the Parliament Building is Heroes Square, a small square built in tribute to the island's many heroes.

Travel to St. George parish for a drive by the historic Gun Hill Station. Built in 1818, this military outpost perched atop a hillside once served as a lookout for approaching ships. Beautifully restored and landscaped by the Barbados National Trust, the station now houses a fascinating collection of military memorabilia and features an imposing statue of a magnificent lion, carved from coral in

Photo opportunities abound when you stop to tour the breathtakingly beautiful St. John's Church, a classic Gothic church situated on a cliff overlooking the picturesque East Coast. Built in 1836 to replace the previous church that had been destroyed by a hurricane, St. John's boasts stunning views of the island as well as a churchyard in which rests the remains of Ferdinando Paleologus, a descendent of Emperor Constantine the Great. The cemetery also contains the remains of the youngest Prime Minister of Barbados who passed away in October 2010. Marvel at the rugged beauty of Bathsheba Beach, located on the East Coast of Barbados. This gorgeous beach stretches along a dramatic coastline where waves, wind and time have conspired to sculpt giant mushroom shaped rock formations that jut majestically out of the pounding surf; the largest of which, the Bathsheba Rock, sits slightly off shore.

Venture inland to the higher elevations of the island where you'll stop and enjoy a complimentary rum drink at the Highland Adventure Center. Located in the heart of Barbados this center is surrounded by lush, tropical landscape and offers spectacular vistas of the island. As your journey of exploration winds down, you'll drive through Holetown in the parish of St. James for a view of the Holetown monument. This soft-stone obelisk commemorates the first settlement in Barbados when Captain John Powell arrived in 1626 on the ship Olive Blossom after being blown off course on his journey from South America to England. Finally, sit back and relax as you enjoy a scenic journey past a number of luxury hotels en route to Bridgetown and your ship in the sparkling waters of the harbor there.

Embark on a scenic journey to discover Barbados by boarding your comfortable, air-conditioned transportation at the pier. Accompanied by a knowledgeable driver/guide, take a scenic ride to Medford Mahogany Creations, the only mahogany carving factory on the island and indulge in an interactive tour of this unique attraction. Peruse the artists' studio and learn how these exquisite sculptures are created. Then browse for one-of-a-kind mahogany pieces that are available for purchase prior to the scenic drive to the stunningly beautiful Christ Church Parish Church. Although the present church was built in 1935, it is the fourth on the site - the previous ones were destroyed by hurricane, fire and flood. The Church is best known for its famous Chase Vault, in which coffins mysteriously moved around within the sealed vault. A detailed investigation in 1820 offered no explanation and the coffins were eventually buried separately with the vault permanently sealed.

After leaving this interesting phenomenon, a leisurely drive will allow you to step back into the past with a visit to the Sunbury Plantation House, located in tranquil St. Philip parish. Built in 1650 by one of the island's first settlers, this beautifully restored house is a monument to plantation life of a bygone era. Stroll through the rooms and take in the amazing collection of antiques, memorabilia and domestic items that were part of everyday life hundreds of years ago. Peruse the root cellar which houses the largest collection of antique carriages in the Caribbean. Roam the extensively landscaped grounds for more fine authentic examples of old carts and machinery used in the last century to cultivate the land. Once you've worked up an appetite the friendly plantation staff will serve up a sumptuous four course plated lunch including local delicacies.

Replete with fine cuisine and a new appreciation for the colorful history of bygone days you will make your way back to your ship along the island's south coast via the historic Garrison district. Once the 18th and 19th century headquarters for members of the British West Indies Regiment in Barbados, it is still home to the Garrison Savannah, the international horseracing track built in 1845. Continue past the stunning St. Patrick's Cathedral, built in 1848. With its carved coral stoned detail and its collection of heraldic plaques honoring the West India Regiment, it is home to the largest Roman Catholic congregation on the island. You will finally be traveling through the winding streets of Bridgetown, which was founded in 1628 by British settlers. They originally named it "Indian

Bridge" for the rope bridge constructed over the river by the Caribbean's indigenous inhabitants.

Have your cameras ready as you drive past the sights of this bustling city including the House of Parliament, the third oldest Parliament in the entire commonwealth which was established in 1639. Opposite the Parliament Building is Heroes Square, a small square built in tribute to the island's many heroes, one of whom is still alive today before your final disembarkation back at the pier.



Did you know that rum was invented in the 17th century right here in Barbados? Or that it's made from a sugar by-product such as molasses? Learn this and much more about rum's history during this fascinating three hour tour.

Your excursion begins when you board your air-conditioned transportation at the pier and embark on a brief guided drive through Bridgetown. Then, it's a short drive to the Mount Gay Rum Distillery.

When you arrive, you will be taken on a guided tour of the Visitors Center, which showcases the world's oldest rum brand. Established in 1703 on this lush plantation, the company was an eyewitness to the arrival of the first distilleries to the island. But soon, it made its mark as one of the most renowned in the Caribbean.

At the Visitor's Center you will be shown a state-of-the-art multimedia presentation that will entertain you with the history of this amazing company. Then, you will be invited to tour the distillery to discover first-hand the process behind the manufacture of the world's oldest rum. Knowledgeable guides will show you how the rum is distilled, aged, blended and bottled using only the finest rich sugar cane, aromatic molasses and pristine coral filtered water native to the island.

After your tour, step into an authentic chattel house, which are moveable homes on blocks originally designed for plantation workers, where you can sample the tasty rum, shop for souvenirs, and purchase a favorite bottle to take home with you.

Your next destination is the Foursquare Rum Distillery. Although it's set on the site of a former sugar factory dating back to 1636, its distillation methods are definitely innovative. Green technology has been utilized in every step of the rum making process and the measurable results are outstanding, making it one of the most modern in the world.

As you drive onto the facility, you'll meander up through a field of sugarcane. Here, you'll find that almost ten acres have been transformed into a beautifully landscaped property complete with gardens, fully restored plantation outbuildings, a petting zoo, an amphitheater, small museums and, of course, a cutting edge rum distillery.

During your visit you'll learn about the company's heritage and its devotion to the 350-year-old Barbadian tradition of rum making. At the end of your tour, you will be escorted into a meeting room near the bottling plant and given the opportunity to taste the different kinds of rum they produce.

Following your visit, you'll reboard your transportation and return back to Bridgetown along a scenic route.

Andromeda Botanical Gardens & Scenic Country Drive

Embark on your journey to experience the full beauty of Barbados by boarding your air-conditioned transportation at the cruise terminal. Then begin a scenic drive through some of the most beautiful landscape in the Caribbean as your friendly and knowledgeable guide regales you with stories about the island's history, culture and natural wonders - including the famous Giant Baobab Tree, brought from Africa in 1738.

Then journey through the countryside to Farley Hill. Situated 850 feet above sea-level, this spot offers an excellent view of the verdant highlands of the Scotland District which covers the parish of St. Andrew and is named after Scotland's Patron Saint. Drive along the East Coast to the sleepy seaside village of Bathsheba where the waves, wind and time have conspired to sculpt giant mushroom shaped rock formations that jut majestically out of the pounding surf - the largest of which is the Bathsheba Rock. You'll have the opportunity to take photos of these stunning formations from the seaside.

A stone's throw away is Andromeda Botanical Gardens in the parish of St. Joseph. Nestled on a cliff overlooking the coast, this lavish six acre garden features over 600 species of exotic plants as well as a grotto-like lily pond and one of the world's largest palms trees. Upon arrival you will be welcomed with a refreshing beverage and given an overview of the gardens and their history. Explore the tranquil meandering paths bordered by orchids, ferns, hibiscus and even the famed bearded fig trees, for which it is believed the original settlers gave the island the name Los Barbados or "the bearded ones". Take time to relax in the quaint café where you can purchase island cuisine.

Continue on through lush hillsides of softly swaying sugarcane to Parks Farm, a bucolic working farm that raises the island's famed black belly sheep. Unique to Barbados, these sheep are believed to have been imported from Africa by early British settlers. Have your cameras at the ready as you may have the opportunity to get a picture with one of the farm's smallest residents, a little black belly lamb.

Before heading back to your ship, take a leisurely drive along winding roads featuring many varieties of plants and lush, overhanging trees among coral stone walls, unique to this island before taking in breathtaking views at Shop Hill of the west and south coasts and the cruise port on the way back to the capital city of Bridgetown.

Harrison's Cave & Scenic Drive

As a start to your leisurely tour of one of the Caribbean's top attractions board your air-conditioned transport at the pier and head out of the bustling port city of Bridgetown for a guided drive. En route, look out for the historic Sharon Moravian Church. Dating back to 1799, this exquisite church remains one of the area's few 18th-century edifices unspoiled by modifications or alterations. Following a brief scenic drive, you'll arrive at the newly renovated Harrison's Cave. Said to be one of the natural wonders of the world, this magnificent, crystallized limestone cavern is named for Thomas Harrison, an early settler who owned much of the land in the area in the 1700s. Developed by the Barbadian government as a show cave, the shafts and tunnels were excavated to access remote chambers and accommodate trams before the caves were opened to the public in 1981.

Then descend 100 feet via a glass elevator to reach the Cave Interpretative Centre (CIC), where, in preparation of your journey into the depths, you'll be treated to pre-tour activities, including a nine minute video about the history of this marvel of nature. Board a new electric tram for a journey of pure wonder through this massive cave system that stretches over 2 miles. At select points you can disembark for photos and a closer look inside the various yawning chambers filled with beautifully lit stalactites, stalagmites and delicate flowstone formations, all created by pure flowing streams over millions of years. Marvel at the majestic 'Cathedral', the caves largest chamber, which measures an impressive 50 feet high.

Take in the awe-inspiring beauty of a thunderous 40-foot waterfall which cascades into an exquisite and mesmerizing blue-green lake. This free flowing water makes Harrison's Cave an active stream cave and contributes to the continuing growth of the stalagmites at a rate of less than the thickness of a piece of paper each year - fast in geological terms! At the end of your remarkable journey beneath the earth, you will board your transport for a scenic drive back to the harbor. It is an opportunity to sit back, relax and contemplate the fact that you can now officially consider yourself a speleologist (a person who explores caves)!

All the while, your knowledgeable co-pilot will regale you with facts about the ecology of this exciting eco system and how fish and other marine life compete for survival in their world. As an added bonus, the submarine will dive down to view what was once reserved for scuba divers only - a mysterious sunken shipwreck!

After surfacing, you will receive an Atlantis Expedition dive certificate to commemorate your underwater journey of discovery. As you enjoy a scenic trip back to shore aboard your ferry, indulge in a complimentary beverage (rum punch anyone?) and take in the distant sights including beautiful west coast beaches.





Nelson's Dockyard, Shirley Heights & Lunch by 4WD



ANU-340 Approximately 6 hours / From \$119

Board your 4WD, open-air Land Rover near the pier and head out to discover the tropical beauty and historic highlights of Antigua. Your specially designed vehicle was built for off-road exploration and your driver will be able to take you down paths where regular tour buses are prohibited. As you drive through the countryside, you'll be entertained with stories on the area's history, folklore, and vibrant culture.

Your off-road adventure begins at Body Pond area, where you'll be charmed by the lush setting and learn about the plants that were used for health remedies. Body Pond area is in the center of the island and was once the main freshwater source. Historic Nelson's Dockyard National Park is not to be missed, and your off-road vehicle easily climbs to the peak, where the Shirley Heights and Blockhouse Ruins await. View the remains of the powder magazine, gun platforms, cisterns, and officer's barracks atop this sheer cliff. From this breezy vantage point, you can see all the way to Montserrat and Guadeloupe on clear days. Continue on to the Shirley Heights Lookout point, where picture-perfect views of Nelson's Dockyard National Park and the English Harbor can be seen. The lookout was once used as a signal station where different flags were flown to warn those in the dockyard of approaching ships.

A short scenic drive brings you down to Nelson's Dockyard, the only Georgian naval dock in the world and a unique Antiguan landmark. Although this is the Caribbean's premier example of a British naval yard, it was actually constructed by Antiquans, Nestled in the cone of a dormant volcano, the dockyard has been well protected for over 500 years from the hurricanes that frequent the area. Built in 1725, the dockyard served as the base for the English naval squadron patrolling the West Indies. It was named for Captain Horatio Nelson, one of Britain's most famous naval heroes. Tour the dockyard and its restored buildings and museum with your knowledgeable guide.

Your final destination is breathtaking Turner Beach, where you'll savor a delightful buffet lunch in a beach front restaurant. Refreshed, you can enjoy free time to swim or stroll along the shoreline prior to driving back to the city and the ship.

Drive through charming Buckley Village and follow a series of narrow dirt tracks along Body Pond. You'll soon find yourself in a lush tropical setting with abundant flora and fauna. Your knowledgeable guide will give you background information on the island's natural foliage. A photo stop in this area is an opportunity to capture the stunning greenery before traveling toward Fig Tree Drive. Contrary to what you may think, you won't see any actual figs along this drive because in Antigua, "fig" is the local word for "banana"! In addition to this fruit, you'll see mango groves and pineapple fields set against a landscape of tiny fishing villages. Skirt the shore and drive past mangrove thickets as your guide explains the ecological role this ever present Caribbean tree plays in the saltwater environment.

The turquoise waters of Turner's Beach beckon you to run along the shore, play in the sand, and take a dip in the warm sea. Gentle trade winds cool the air and on clear days you can see as far as the island of Montserrat from the shore. A welcome respite in your day, the beach is a perfect spot for sunbathing, beach combing, and frolicking. A refreshing beverage is offered in this picturesque spot before you re-board your 4WD vehicle for a return drive to port.

There are 12 different ziplines, 3 aerial walkways, 1 vertical descent (optional), 1 tree house and 1 suspension bridge that will take you through the forest and crisscross the gorge, which is filled with interesting plants and fruits. Each zip line segment is different and they range from 52 feet to 328 feet in length soaring as high as 300 feet. Exhilarating!

Once back on terra firma, there is a short hike back to the starting point where you will be offered a complimentary beverage and a bravery certificate as a souvenir of your accomplishment. There are complimentary lockers and drinking stations throughout the course. Re-board your transportation for the drive back to port.





"A Wall Street investment genius and prolific philanthropist," according to Forbes magazine, Leon Levy made a huge impact on the world. This 25-acre ecologically sustainable sanctuary was created jointly by the Bahamas National Trust and the Leon Levy Foundation in 2006, when Shelby White, Leon Levy's widow, approached the Bahamas National Trust about creating an appropriate memorial to her husband on Eleuthera.

Located in Governor's Harbor, The Preserve is a living part of Bahamian history. It is the first national park on the island and an environmental education center and a facility for the propagation of native plants and trees. Visitors can now walk miles of trails throughout the native habitat and view the beautiful orchids, the edible and medicinal plants, and the hardwood trees that played an important role in the development of the island. This amazing 25-acre preserve brims with many different species of palms, mangroves and ferns. Medicinal plants range from well-known species like aloe vera to more obscure plants which islanders have kept in their medicine kits for centuries.

Eleuthera is an island in the Bahamas 50 miles east of Nassau. It is 110 miles long and in places little more than 1 mile wide. The name "Eleuthera" is derived from the feminine form of a Greek adjective that means "free." The topography of the island varies from wide rolling pink sand beaches to large outcrops of ancient coral reefs. The eastern side of the island faces the Atlantic Ocean while the western side faces the Great Bahama Bank.

Continuing your scenic island tour, you'll enjoy the charm and diversity of the capital of Eleuthera, Governor's Harbor. Please keep in mind that you will receive your tickets when you arrive onboard and all of your shore excursion purchases are charged to your shipboard account. Advance payment is not accepted. Since shore excursions have limited capacity, we encourage you to reserve your tours as early as possible to avoid disappointment and confirm the best price. Reservations are processed on a first-come, first-served basis.

You may change shore excursion requests, but be advised that shore excursion prices may change. Requests to add tickets at a later time can be made but these tickets may be at a higher price than those previously booked. If you request a shore excursion which you previously cancelled, these requests will be confirmed at the current shore excursion price, which may be higher.

Q. HOW DO I RESERVE MY LAND EXCURSIONS IN ADVANCE OF MY CRUISETOUR?

A. When you are ready to pre-reserve your land excursions, go to the Cruise Personalizer and have your booking number and credit card information ready to enter. A credit card must be registered for each passenger that wishes to participate on a land excursion and we accept Princess Visa, Visa, MasterCard, American Express, Discover and Diner's Club. Credit cards used to pre-reserve land excursions must be valid through the full length of your cruisetour and may also be used to establish your shipboard account. Although a credit card is required to reserve your excursion(s), quests are able to pre-reserve all of their land excursions with no deposit required. An auto-charge of all pre-reserved excursions will take place two days prior to your first Land Excursion booking. Confirmed pre-reserved excursions can be viewed at any time in your detailed itinerary in the Cruise Personalizer. The Cruise Personalizer will remain open until your cruisetour departure date so you may add or cancel tours prior to the cancellation deadline without penalty. Excursions cancelled once the auto-charge has been processed are subject to a 100% penalty. Note that excursion availability is based on cruisetour date, capacity limitations, and suitable weather conditions. Excursions are subject to change at any time and available on a first-come, first-serve basis. Guests are encouraged to book early as space is limited and flightseeing tours in particular may not be available for pre-reserving right up to tour departure date. Prior to travel, print your Travel Summary which will have a listing of all of your pre-reserved land excursions. You will also receive information on confirmed excursions in your Welcome Envelope upon arrival at each location.

Q. HOW CAN I BE SURE I AM CONFIRMED ON THE EXCURSIONS I WANT?

A. When you book your excursions online at princess.com, you receive an immediate confirmation of the status and price of your requested excursion. The site shows the remaining capacity on all tours, so you know if you are confirmed or waitlisted. To avoid disappointment and confirm the best price, please reserve your excursions as early as possible. If the specific tour time you requested is fully booked, Princess may schedule you on an alternate departure that corresponds with your other tour selections.

If your shore excursion choice is not available, we will put you on a waitlist and attempt to obtain more space on the shore excursion. If you have companions traveling with you in your stateroom or in other staterooms and would like everyone to be on the same shore excursion departure, order all the excursions under one name. Requests made individually, even if at the same time, may cause you to be booked on a different departure than your companions or waitlisted on an excursion for which your companions are confirmed.

Land Excursions can not be waitlisted but we actively request more space wherever possible from our tour operators; if a tour is sold out we encourage guests to revisit the Cruise Personalizer at a later date and they can also check for more availability at the tour desks in our Alaska ports.

Q. MAY I TAKE MORE THAN ONE TOUR IN A SINGLE PORT OF CALL?

A. Yes. In Alaska, Canada/New England, the Caribbean, Panama Canal, Hawaii and Mexico, allow at least 30 minutes between each tour. In all other regions, allow at least 60 minutes between each tour. All tours depart from, and return to, the cruise ship pier. By scheduling the appropriate amount of time between tours, you will have sufficient time to take multiple excursions.

Q. CAN I CANCEL AN SHORE EXCURSION I'VE REQUESTED?

A. Due to the limited capacity and high demand for helicopter flights and private vehicle options, these shore excursions are not refundable unless cancelled by 12:00pm on the day after embarkation.

For all other shore excursions, a "Closing Time for Bookings" for each port of call is listed on the Tour Order Form you will receive onboard in your stateroom. This is the time when the bookings for the tours in that port close and we notify the local operators of the final shore excursion requirements. You may cancel an excursion if it is prior to the closing time whether you reserved in advance or onboard. We cannot cancel a shore excursion if it is past this closing time, nor can we refund shore excursions on which you choose not to go. All shore excursions operate rain or shine unless cancelled by the tour operator.

Q. CAN I CANCEL A LAND EXCURSION I'VE REQUESTED?

A. Due to the exclusive nature and advanced planning required for excursions involving hotel accommodations, airline flights and some flightseeing tours, these excursions are not refundable within 30 days of sailing. A fee will be assessed onboard for any of these tours cancelled within 30 days of sailing.

Land Excursions, pre-reserved through the Cruise Personalizer, may be cancelled up to the Land Excursion cancellation deadline which is two days prior to your first land excursion booking. At the cancellation deadline, all pre-reserved land excursions will be auto-charged using the credit card that you provided in the Cruise Personalizer to reserve your tours. Excursions cancelled once the auto-charge has been processed are subject to a 100% penalty, unless the operator, at their sole discretion, is unable to operate the program due to unforeseen circumstances. All sales of tours booked while on your land tour are considered final at the time of purchase and are 100% non-refundable except in the case of an operator approved cancellation.

Q. CAN I REQUEST TO BE REFUNDED FOR MY LAND EXCURSION.

A. In the event of any excursion being cancelled for reasons beyond our control, a full refund will be made. Land

Excursions that were pre-reserved, charged and then cancelled due to weather or other operator approved cancellation will be refunded using the same credit card used to book your excursions. These refunds will typically be reflected on your credit card statement between 7-10 business days after cancellation. Tours booked while on your land tour are considered final at the time of purchase and are 100% non-refundable except in the case of a cancellation by the vendor. Should any excursion have to be abandoned through force majeure or difficulties en route, the best possible refund will be arranged according to the circumstances.

Q. HOW DOES THE PRINCESS EXCURSIONS PROGRAM OPERATE ONBOARD?

A. Our Shore Excursion Manager runs the onboard portion of the Princess Shore Excursions program. Tour Office staff are available to answer questions and make shore excursion reservations for you. Once onboard in your stateroom, you will find tickets for the shore excursions you reserved in advance. If you have not yet reserved tours or would like to purchase additional shore excursions, you will find a Tour Order Form in your stateroom. You will also find a schedule of daily activities, the Princess Patter, which features important program information including Tour Office hours and the closing time for shore excursion bookings. Remember, tickets are sold on a first-come, first-served basis and space on shore excursions is limited, so book early. A Tour Order Form drop box is located near the Tour Office where you may deposit your order form at any time.

Q. ARE THERE CHILDREN'S PRICES AVAILABLE?

A. Yes, on some tours for children age 12 and under. If you are traveling with children, please pre-reserve the number of child tickets you would like on the Cruise Personalizer. If the adult and child price is the same, please order all tickets as adult. Once onboard the ship or at one of our land excursion destinations, check your tour tickets to ensure you have received the correct number of adult and child tickets. Visit the Tour Office as soon as possible to make any necessary adjustments. Parents are also responsible for bringing a safety seat for their child.

On most helicopter and flightseeing tours, children 24 months of age and older are required to have their own seat. Children under 24 months are considered lap infants and may ride free of charge if the tour operator can accommodate them - with prior arrangement through the onboard Tour Office. Parents must show proof of age to the tour operator for any lap infant. Children under the age of 24 months are not able to participate on a helicopter tour.

Q. ARE PRIVATE SHORE EXCURSION OPTIONS AVAILABLE WHERE I CAN CUSTOMIZE MY TOUR?

A. Yes, in many ports we offer shore excursions that can be customized to your specifications. On these tours you are able to book exclusive use of the tour vehicle (automobile, boat or plane) and tailor the tour to include activities and venues you want to experience.

Due to the limited capacity and highly specialized nature of these excursions, they are not refundable unless cancelled by 12:00pm on the day after embarkation or prior to the booking closing time for the port which is listed on the onboard Tour Order Form (whichever is first). Once onboard the ship, you may be provided with a preference card to advise the tour operator of your selected itinerary and interests. The onboard Tour Staff will gladly assist you and provide recommendations.

Please note these shore excursions are sold per transport, not per person, so only one passenger should make the reservation for the entire group. This is a private arrangement and those accompanying you are the guests you choose; Princess does not match up individual passengers to form a private group for the vehicle. The price listed includes the means of transport and/or private guide and does not include gratuities, meals and attraction entrance fees (unless indicated otherwise) as these will vary based on your choices.

Q. ARE THERE AGE OR OTHER RESTRICTIONS ON TOURS?

A. For most tours, there is no minimum age for children as long as they are accompanied by a parent or guardian. Passengers under the age of 18 years cannot participate without a parent or guardian. Please review the tour description notes for the most current restrictions and any exceptions; a few operators may allow an unaccompanied minor on tour if a wavier is signed by the parent or guardian in the operator's presence. Any other restrictions imposed by the tour operator are listed in the "Special Notes" section of each tour description.

Q. IS A VISA REQUIRED FOR ANY OF THE PORTS I VISIT?

A. Please review the information detailed in the "Itinerary" section of the Cruise Personalizer regarding any applicable visas for your specific voyage.

Q. IS ANY ADDITIONAL DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED TO PARTICIPATE ON SHORE EXCURSIONS?

A. Passports, visas and other documentation may be required on certain shore excursions. Please review the "Special Notes" section of the shore excursion for full details. Notarized written consent is required for children crossing international borders without both parents.

Q. ARE THE EXCURSIONS GUIDED?

A. Yes. All of our excursions include local English-speaking guides except for On Your Own tours and where otherwise noted.

Q. SHOULD I TIP THE TOUR GUIDE?

A. Tipping is a discretionary matter; however, it is customary, if one is pleased with their tour, to tip the tour guide. A

general rule of thumb is \$2 per person for a half-day tour and \$5 per person for a full-day tour.

Q. WHAT TYPE OF CLOTHING SHOULD I WEAR WHILE ON TOUR OR IN PORT?

A. During your cruise, the climate can range from temperate and cool to hot and humid. Please plan to dress in layered, light- to medium-weight clothing and comfortable, low-heeled walking shoes. Since weather conditions may vary, we suggest you also pack a sweater, a light jacket and an all-weather coat. In addition, don't forget a hat or visor, a collapsible umbrella, sunglasses, sun screen and of course your camera and extra film and batteries. Please note that for water-related excursions where we suggest you wear your bathing suit, cover-up and hat, we have placed a symbol next to the shore excursion description.

If you plan to participate on an overland tour and will need to recharge video equipment or use a hair dryer, we suggest you bring an international adapter. Whenever you plan on going ashore, we highly encourage you to leave your valuables and jewelry onboard. While ashore, please take care in protecting your purses, cameras and other personal items. Minimizing personal belongings brought ashore could expedite the security process when reboarding the ship. We suggest you carry a photocopy of your passport when going ashore as you may need your passport number to exchange currency.

Please be mindful that in some of the countries you will visit, the local people may have somewhat more conservative views concerning dress than those to which you are accustomed. Generally shorts, tank tops, and short skirts are not acceptable dress when visiting churches or places of worship. Specific information regarding appropriate dress in these ports is provided with the shore excursion. For all golf tours, collared shirts and either long pants or Bermudastyle shorts are required (no cut-offs, bathing suits, etc.).

Q. WILL I MISS MEALS IF I GO ON SHORE EXCURSIONS?

A. Our wide variety of dining venues, including a 24-hour buffet, means there are always meal options available onboard that fit within the shore excursion timing you select.

Q. IS THERE TIME FOR SHOPPING ON THE EXCURSIONS?

A. Shopping is, for many, an important part of travel and, wherever possible, time for this activity is allowed within the framework of many of our shore excursions. Please note, however, that the actual amount of time available for shopping is generally limited.

Q. DO THE EXCURSIONS INCLUDE MUCH WALKING AND STAIR CLIMBING?

A. All of our excursions involve some walking and some excursions include more walking and stair climbing than others. Walking may be over uneven surfaces such as cobblestone city streets or the rocky pathways of ancient ruins. On many excursions, it is necessary to negotiate stairs. Please keep in mind that many of the buildings you will be visiting may have been constructed well before conveniences such as elevators were invented and have been preserved in their original state. Please refer to our tour symbols with each excursion description for more information and guidance.

Q. WHAT ELSE SHOULD I ANTICIPATE IN PORTS?

A. Keep in mind that some sites you will be visiting are extremely popular among both tourists and locals. Therefore, you may encounter crowded conditions, whether participating in one of our tours or sightseeing on your own. Regrettably, we have no control over this situation. With regard to photography, some venues may prohibit the use of flash cameras, so fast-speed film is recommended. In some places, photography or video may be prohibited altogether or a fee may be imposed. We ask that you observe any restrictions and, if in doubt, ask your guide for assistance.

Q. AM I REQUIRED TO WEAR SAFETY EQUIPMENT ON TOUR?

A. Yes, on certain tours it is mandatory that you wear the appropriate safety equipment in order to participate. Such equipment includes, but is not limited to snorkel vests, life vests, helmets, etc.

Q. WHAT IS REQUIRED TO PARTICIPATE IN A CERTIFIED DIVE TOUR?

A. An open-water scuba certification card must be presented in order to participate in a certified dive tour. Unfortunately, we are unable to accommodate divers with either a Junior Open Water or a Scuba Diver rating due to the depth limitations imposed by these certifications. The sport-diving industry recommends that divers take an update course if they have not been diving within the last six months. Please note that some dive operators may reserve the right to refuse to take divers who cannot provide proof of the date of their last dive or scuba review course. We recommend you bring a log book or proof that you have recently completed a review course.

There are certain medical conditions that may prevent your participation. Accordingly, you will be required to complete a medical-history form and liability waiver/release form that will be supplied onboard or by the tour operator. Following is a non-inclusive list of several medical conditions that may prevent you from safely participating in scuba diving. Any of these conditions would also require an examination prior to your cruise by a qualified physician to obtain written permission to participate in scuba diving activities. Heart disease or previous heart attack, diabetes, epilepsy or seizures, high blood pressure or the need to take medication to control blood pressure, pregnancy, asthma or any form of lung disease, recent surgery, blackouts, sinus problems, fear of closed spaces, recurring complicated migraines headaches, recurrent ear problems, severe motion sickness and presently taking prescription

medicines with the exception of birth control. Passengers are welcome to bring and use their own personal equipment, but is must be stored in their stateroom and there is no reduction in the tour price.

Q. ARE THERE ANY SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS FOR PARTICIPATING IN AN INTRODUCTORY/DISCOVER SCUBA DIVING TOUR?

A. Yes, there are certain medical conditions that may prevent your participation. Accordingly, you must complete a medical history form and liability waiver/release form that will be provided on board or by the tour operator at the beginning of the tour. Following is a non-inclusive list of several medical conditions that may prevent you from safely participating in scuba diving. Any of these conditions would also require an examination prior to your cruise by a qualified physician to obtain written permission to participate in scuba diving activities. Heart disease or previous heart attack, diabetes, epilepsy or seizures, high blood pressure or take medicine to control blood pressure, presently taking prescription medicines with the exception of birth control, pregnancy, asthma or any form of lung disease, recent surgery, blackouts, sinus problems, fear of closed spaces, recurring complicated migraine headaches, recurrent ear problems, and severe motion sickness. For Introductory Scuba Diving tours there is a minimum age of 10. Passengers under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult.

Q. ARE THERE ANY SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS FOR PARTICIPATING IN A SNUBA DIVING, HELMET DIVING OR UNDERWATER SCOOTER TOUR?

A. Yes, there are certain medical conditions that may prevent your participation. Accordingly, you will be required to complete a medical-history form and liability waiver/release form that will be supplied onboard or by the tour operator. Following is a non-inclusive list of several medical conditions that may prevent you from safely participating in scuba diving. Any of these conditions would also require an examination prior to your cruise by a qualified physician to obtain written permission to participate in scuba diving activities. Heart disease or previous heart attack, diabetes, epilepsy or seizures, high blood pressure or take medicine to control blood pressure, presently taking prescription medicines with the exception of birth control, pregnancy, asthma or any form of lung disease, recent surgery, blackouts, sinus problems, fear of closed spaces, recurring complicated migraine headaches, recurrent ear problems, and severe motion sickness. For helmet or SNUBA tours there is a minimum age of 8 years and passengers must weigh at least 75 pounds. For underwater scooter tours there is a minimum age of 10.

Q. ON SPORTFISHING EXCURSIONS, DO I GET TO KEEP THE FISH I CATCH?

A. Most sportfishing tours offered by Princess are part of a catch-and-release program. Fish that are edible and not endangered are typically landed and kept by the boat crew. Please remember you have purchased an opportunity to catch fish, not a guarantee of doing so. As one of our boat captains said, "We guarantee fishing, not catching."

In Alaska only, if your tour is not designated as catch and release, your catch can be processed and shipped home for an additional charge as arranged by the tour operator. Because of its perishable nature and U.S. Customs regulations, your catch may not be sent outside of the United States in most cases. Due to federal regulations, your catch may not be stored onboard the ship, but may be prepared for dinner onboard. Fish caught while at our lodges in Alaska, needs to be shipped home if not part of a catch-and-release program. In Alaska, fishing licenses are required and can be purchased on your boat for \$20 per person in cash (rates subject to change). Fishing for king salmon requires an additional \$10 retention tag (rates subject to change). Children under 16 do not need a license. Fish runs are dependent on spawning seasons, so during May and late-September fish stock may be more limited. Go to www.adfg.state.ak.us for more details on licensing requirements and fishing regulations in Alaska.

Q. WHAT SHOULD I KNOW BEFORE TAKING A HELICOPTER TOUR?

A. Due to weight and balance limitations, as well as passenger safety and comfort, the helicopter excursion companies have advised that passengers weighing 250 pounds or more (fully clothed) will be assessed a surcharge to reserve adequate space onboard the helicopter. The surcharge amount will be indicated in the "Special Notes" section of each tour.

Because of the limited capacity and high demand for helicopter tours, they are not refundable unless cancelled by 12:00pm on the day after embarkation. Children 24 months of age and older are required to have their own seat. Children under 24 months are considered lap infants and may ride free of charge if the tour operator can accommodate them - with prior arrangement through the onboard Tour Office. Parents must show proof of age to the tour operator for any lap infant.

Carry-on bags are not allowed and limited secure storage is provided at the heliport. Helicopters may carry up to six guests depending on combined group weight. The flight length is approximate and flight route may vary due to weather conditions. Helicopter tours may be cancelled on short notice due to weather or safety issues. Warm clothing and sunglasses are recommended on helicopter tours. Dressing in layers is practical and lets you adjust your attire to meet changing conditions.

For helicopter tours in Denali National Park, a surcharge is not charged for guest over 250lbs. The helicopter company will assign aircraft and seats based on weight and balance. While every consideration is made to keep traveling companions and/or families together, this is not always possible for safety reasons.

Q. DOES PRINCESS OWN THE TOUR COMPANIES IN THE PORTS?

A. No, all of the shore excursions are operated by local, independent companies not by Princess; Princess retains a

portion of the total sale. We selected only the most reputable companies available to provide your excursions. The companies providing your excursions are selected by Princess based on their excellent reputation for service and safety.

Q. WHAT DO YOU RECOMMEND FOR PHYSICALLY CHALLENGED PASSENGERS?

A. Our answer, of course, depends on the type and degree of the disability. The goal of Princess Cruises is to provide a safe comfortable cruise experience for all passengers. If you will be using a mobility device during your sailing we strongly recommend you travel with a person physically fit to assist with your needs both onboard and ashore.

If passengers are able to walk on their own, we recommend tours designated as requiring a moderate level of activity. The transport on some tours may be able to accommodate a collapsible wheelchair stored below the bus; scooters or motorized wheelchairs are often too large. If confined to a wheelchair, we would recommend reserving the excursions identified as wheelchair accessible (see Tour Symbols listed for each tour) or a private vehicle shore excursion. We also recommend that non-ambulatory passengers be accompanied by someone who is able to assist them throughout the duration of their day. Our Tour Staff can provide more information on touring options for non-ambulatory guests. Physically challenged passengers participating on a shore excursion must contact the Tour Office at least 48 hours prior to your excursion to ensure arrangements can be made to meet your particular needs.

Embarking and disembarking can be challenging for those with limited mobility. Many major ports of call provide easy access for wheelchairs and scooters. However due to various conditions: steepness of the gangway, weather, shoreside facilities and tidal and sea conditions, passengers using mobility devices may be required to transfer to a stair climber or be precluded from going ashore. Princess staff will make every effort to assist but are not allowed to individually physically lift more than 50 pounds (22 kg).

Some ports of call require the ship to anchor off shore. Passengers are then taken to shore by small boats or tenders. When tendering is required, passengers using mobility devices will not be transferred into or out of the tender, if lifting in excess of the above limitation is required. Many tender ports do not provide wheelchair access so even if the passenger can board the tender they may not be able to disembark ashore. Again the shoreside facilities, movement of the tender, weather and tidal conditions can also preclude tendering.

The decision to allow any passenger to board a tender or disembark the vessel will be made by the Captain on the basis of the safety and welfare of all involved and is final. If passengers are unable to tender or disembark because of circumstances outlined above there will be no refund or credit for missed ports. While Princess recognizes your disappointment the safety of both passengers and crew takes precedence.

For more information on the terms and conditions for Princess Shore Excursions, please refer to the Special Information section. Every effort will be made to accommodate all passengers on the tour of their choice but, tours are operated by independent local companies and not by Princess. The final determination to let any passenger participate is made by the tour operator and therefore if, in the judgment of the tour operator, the safety or comfort of any passenger is in question, guests may be denied participation. This evaluation may not be able to be determined until meeting directly with the local tour operator.

Special Information

CONDITIONS In selling tickets (including coupons or vouchers) or otherwise promoting or making arrangements for Excursions— whether for air, land or local water transportation; tours; sports or any other recreational activities; shore accommodations or meals or for any service, facility or activity other than onboard Princess' cruise ships — Princess acts only as agent for the independent tour operator supplying such excursions or services. Participation by a passenger in Excursions is conditioned upon such passenger's acceptance of the terms and conditions set forth in the Passage Contract contained in the Cruise Ticket, the Excursion Ticket and, depending on the activity, other documents which, among other things, expressly release Princess from any liability for such participation. Participation may also be subject to the independent tour operators' own terms and conditions.

EXCURSION TIMINGS Departure times for each tour will be listed on princess.com in the Cruise Personalizer. For Shore Excursions, they will also be listed on the Tour Order Form, which you will receive onboard. These have been published according to information from our Tour Operators, but are subject to change should the vessel's arrival time at any port be delayed, or the itinerary for any particular excursion be amended. Please note that the time shown will be the time the last tour vehicle leaves the pier or hotel. Passengers are requested to report to the specified departure location (either onboard ship or shoreside) at the designated time, as delay on your part can interfere with the pleasure of your fellow passengers.

EXCURSIONS WITH LIMITED PARTICIPATION Shore Excursions may be purchased in advance of your cruise departure or onboard ship on a first-come, first served basis. Many of our excursions have limited participation and reservation requests will be processed in the order received. When excursions are fully subscribed, additional requests will be placed on a waiting list in the order received. Land Excursions can not be waitlisted but we actively request more space wherever possible from our tour operators; if a tour is sold out we encourage guests to revisit the Cruise Personalizer at a later date and they can also check for more availability at the tour desks in our Alaska ports.

PERSONAL POSSESSIONS Coats, wraps, umbrellas, cameras, handbags, traveling bags and similar personal articles remain at all times through the tour under the passenger's custody and control. Be careful that you do not leave your possessions unattended at any time in the car or coach in which you are traveling.

PRICES The prices for Excursions are subject to change without notice; are per adult, per child or in some cases per vehicle. Prices are confirmed at the time of booking. All quotations made include conveyance according to the itinerary and, where applicable, meals, refreshments, guides and entrance fees, unless otherwise stated. Children, other than infants in arms, will be charged full fare unless noted otherwise.

SHOPPING Where possible, time for shopping has been allowed within the framework of some excursions. However, excursions are not primarily designed for shopping, and time allowed for this purpose may be limited.

REFUNDS No refunds can be made on any ticket, coupon or voucher unless notice of cancellation is given before the closing date indicated on the booking form for the excursions involved. The times when bookings will close will be published onboard. In the event of any excursion being canceled for reasons beyond our control, a full refund will be made. However, should any excursion have to be abandoned through force majeure or difficulties en route, the best possible refund will be arranged according to the circumstances. Land Excursions that were pre-reserved, charged and then cancelled due to weather or other operator approved cancellation will be refunded using the same credit card used to book your excursions. These refunds will typically be reflected on your credit card statement between 7-10 business days after cancellation. Tours booked while on your land tour are considered final at the time of purchase and are 100% non-refundable except in the case of a cancellation by the vendor.

TRANSPORTATION Passengers should appreciate that standards of transport vary considerably throughout the world. Air-conditioned coaches are not available in many areas, and in some, local buses are the best available. Cars or taxis are also used at some ports where coach or bus transportation is not available or limited. Passengers wishing to travel with friends should all leave the ship together, as this will help the Tour Staff to allocate them space in the same vehicle. For the comfort of all passengers, smoking is prohibited aboard all sightseeing vehicles.

WITHDRAWAL OF TOURS The Tour Operator reserves the right to withdraw any excursion through lack of demand and to make any alterations that they may deem advisable for the comfort of the passengers, bearing in mind the convenience and best interest of each group.

ECOLOGY & ENVIRONMENT. It is our policy to maintain a positive and proactive position in relation to the environment. We realize that there is much work to be done to achieve our company goals. To this end we are continually striving to increase awareness of any environmental issues that are likely to affect any of the excursions we offer. We work closely with our local agents to convey any environmental messages in our shore excursion programs and therefore ask you to support us in our efforts by respecting the cultures, customs and environmental issues of the various destinations we visit.
